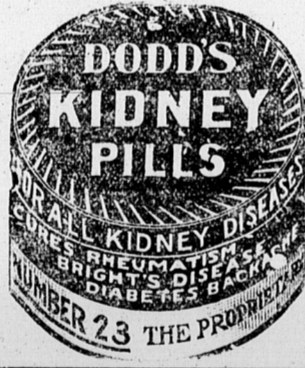

The matches were played in ideal golfing weather on the links at Englewood.

Miss Campbell surprised her acquaintances this afternoon by the announcement that she expects hereafter to make her home on this side of the Atlantic, at Toronto, where she will go next week.

Miss Campbell is making plans to play in the 1910 women's championship of the United States.

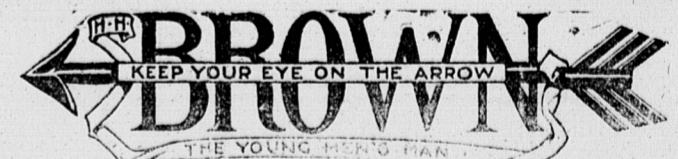
