WIFE IN P. E. ISLAND - The following additional particulars of the auto accident already briefly reported appears in a St. John exchange of July 21st: - Mr. Allan McLean had been away on his holidays with his wife in Prince Edward Island, and had left her behind visiting friends there. She has been notified of the accident. His condition last night was very much improved. The accident caused much comment, as occurrences of this kind are rare in St. John, but those in the car say it was due to the fact that Mr. McLean appeared to be about to pass on one side of the car and then suddenly changed his mind, evidently misjudging the direction in which the car was heading. Allan McLean, aged thirty-one, of Foxboro (Mass.), was run over on Saturday evening about 6 o'clock by an automobile on Market square, and suffered serious internal injuries, but it is now expected that he will recover. On the charge of driving the car without a license the driver, A. Differson, was arrested yesterday. Mr. McLean was going to Reed's Point to take the Boston boat, by which he was to return home. He had just stepped off the sidewalk when he saw the automobile approaching from Prince William Street. He hesitated as to whether to let the car pass, but seemed to change his mind and stepped in front of the machine which knocked him down with the radiator, both wheels passing over his body. The car dragged the man along for a few feet, and the chauffeur, Axel Differson, of 40 Leinster Street, evidently lost control. The back seat struck a telegraph pole with some violence and women sitting in it, Mrs. C. Dummer and Mrs. Allan, were thrown to the ground, suffering a severe shock and bruises. The driver succeeded in pulling up the car within a few yards. Both he and George H. Moore, who was beside him, kept their seats. Mr. McLean was found to be unconscious, and it was feared at first that he would not live. Dr. T. E. Bishop, who was near when the accident occurred, rendered first aid to the injured, and the ambulance was soon called. The man was taken at once to the general hospital, where he showed signs of improvement within an hour.

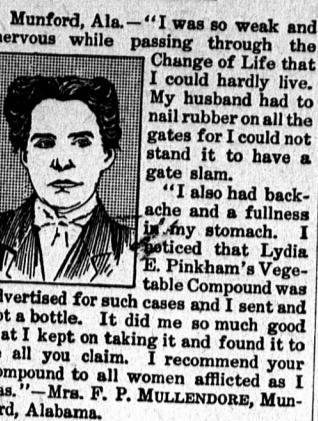
