AFFAIRS IN OTTAWA

(Continued from page one.) question of the Prince Albert land transfer might be threshed out. The debate outside of this incident was sadly deficient in life.

Hon. Charles Murphy and Verille sought to intervene by proclaiming their refusal to be bound by the new rules, a refusal which appeared to occasion the Government little concern.

Eight Liberals talked on the closure, most of them briefly. Hon. Wm. Pugsley turned up in his accustomed place and was much in evidence in the discussion of points of procedure. His researches so far seem to have resulted in nothing more formidable than the discovery that the Opposition may come along at intervals with motions to adjourn. If there is anything more than this up the Opposition sleeve only Mr. Pugsley and Co. know of it. The rank and file have not been told. The whips expect a vote tomorrow night, so there is very little time left for fireworks.

When the evening opened Mr. Borden announced that he had consulted Mr. Rogers who was very anxious there should be no delay in having the charges against him laid. Accordingly he would tomorrow, Thursday, move the House into supply to give Mr. Oliver his opportunity. Mr. Oliver, Mr. Graham and Mr. Pugsley were satisfied with this but tried to raise the case of the ruling during the blockade that when a motion to adjourn is made the debate must be confined to the actual motion to adjourn and must not deal with the subject of the motion formerly under discussion.

The Speaker said that while there were cases of such when the previous question had been moved where the debate could properly be on the original motion the usual rule of relevancy was that the debate must be on the motion made.

These technical points settled, the closure debate dragged its slow length along. Mr. Charles Murphy denounced closure, largely on the ground that it had originally been introduced to enable a bill to be forced through for the coercion of Ireland. He admitted that in 1911 he had spoken in favor of closure, had maintained that it should have been effected by a committee of the House, not by the Government.

Mr. Verille affected his usual mixture of the characters of a Labor member and a straight Liberal. As the former he promised in the coming summer to attend Labor gatherings at St. John and Halifax; at the latter he stated he would tell the St. John men about Hazen's evil behaviour and the Halifax men of Mr. Borden's sins against free speech.

Two French-Canadian Liberals, Mr. Lapointe and Mr. Gauthier, spoke in French and Mr. Thomson spoke briefly. Five speakers got their addresses into little over two hours.
