LOOKING 'EM OVER

James J. Corbett Passes

Jim Corbett, one of the most vivid figures of fistiana, passed to the great beyond on Saturday last. The hand that rocked the world when it put Sullivan to sleep is stilled, but the brain that was the mainspring of his success was clear to the end. A fine sport figure is no more. Corbett defeated a great idol in Sullivan, just as Tunney did when he trounced the Dempsey escutcheon by two defeats. Both overcame the unpopularity that followed these exploits, to take a rightful place among the great figures of the ring. Both graduated from the resin to better endings, will be remembered as much for what they accomplished afterwards as for their fistic exploits. In crushing Sullivan, the iconoclastic Corbett upset a tradition. John L. was an institution in the days of the later eighties, and early nineties. He was a large truculent man who loved to invade bar rooms, announcing to all that he could lick any man in the house. He even took them up for friend, or loved foe. The Stein Song was his favorite melody. Before he died he became a lecturer on temperance, deeply regretting the days when he was the "tavern knight" of fistiana.
