New Power Will Revolutionize

War and Insure The Peace of The World - Motorite to Shoot Torpedo Through Sea at a Mile a Minute.

NEW YORK, January 10.—A new torpedo that will hurt itself at a battleship's hull faster than a mile a minute.

A new submarine torpedo boat that will bore a path beneath the surface of the water at the rate of sixty miles an hour.

A new locomotive power—motorite—to propel the torpedo and the torpedo boat so powerfully that if necessary it will shoot them rocket-like out of the sea.

This trinity of inventions, evolved together, patented side by side by Hudson Maxim and announced through the press this morning by the inventor himself, will be put at the disposal of the United States government the most destructive engines of the naval warfare possessed by any nation of the world.

OBITUARY.

Edmund Horne, of Winsloe Road.

As announced a few days ago another distinguished citizen has passed on to his eternal reward in the person of Edmund Horne of Winsloe, Lot 33. Mr. Horne was born in London, England, and emigrated to Prince Edward Island with his father and mother and the rest of the family of six sons and two daughters, Edmund being the youngest son. He was only seven years of age when he left London. The family landed in Charlottetown in 1839. They remained here only a short time when his father bought a farm on the St. Peter's Road Cemetery, where they all lived for a few years. Mr. Horne's father having been well acquainted with the late Mr. Hodges, land agent for the Winsloe estate, Mr. Hodges induced him and his family to take up land on the Winsloe estate. Consequently he obtained 600 acres situated on the Winsloe Road. At that time there was no road to this land. It was covered with heavy timber. The family had to cut down and clear away the heavy timber before they could build the present Winsloe Road. It is the seventh road that the late Edmund Horne helped to make to get from the Malpeque Road to the farm. Though the late Edmund Horne lived and did much on the old homestead, where he spent many a day's work, clearing the forest for several years before he died, he saw the whole acre cleared of the forest and all under cultivation. At the age of twenty-one years he married Miss Charlotte Spittle and settled on a small piece of land where he reared a family of four sons and three daughters. As the sons grew up they began to buy back piece by piece the old homestead, till he again had the old homestead with the exception of one small piece. He settled his sons giving each a farm. He had the pleasure of seeing his family, both sons and daughters, all settled close around him. There is not one break in the family. All are living and doing well.

Edmund Horne died December 23rd, 1907, aged 84 years. He leaves behind him four sons Fred H., John and the farms adjoining the old homestead, and Henry on the old homestead, and Alexander of the firm of A. Horne & Co., Charlottetown. Mrs. John Coles, of Charlottetown, Mrs. John Bryenton, Brackley Point Road, Mrs. John Burrows, of Highfield. He was buried at Milton Cemetery on Thursday, December 26, 1907. Mrs. Horne, died seven years ago. The pallbearers were: A. W. Holroyd, John R. Hooper, Charles Bryant, John T. Reid, George Howard and John Good. The deceased was a good farmer, and was respected by all. He was upright in all his business transactions.
