**Pig Iron Output Up For October**

OTTAWA, Dec. 11—(CP)— Pig iron production in October showed a "substantial recovery" as a result of the return to work of steel workers following the end of the strike, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported today.

Production totaled 74,958 tons, compared with 45,078 in September. During October, 1945, 140,938 tons were produced. During the first 10 months of the current year 1,107,026 tons of pig iron were produced, compared with 1,503,082 tons in the similar period last year.

Production of steel ingots and steel castings also moved up in October, totalling 123,841 tons compared with 76,564. Output for October last year was 205,846 tons. During the 10 months ended Oct. 1, 1,874,687 tons were produced compared with 2,454,091 in the same period last year.

There was recovery also in the production of ferro-alloys when 8,448 tons were produced compared with 6,164 in September. Output for October last year was 14,345 tons. During the first 10 months of this year output aggregated 95,859 tons, compared with 158,182 in the similar period of 1945.

**Nobel Prize Awards Made At Stockholm**

STOCKHOLM, Dec. 11—(AP)— Nobel prizes were presented today to nine persons in brilliant ceremonies in Stockholm and Oslo attended by royalty and other leading figures of the two countries. Seven scientific and literary prizes were presented here. The Peace prizes, shared by two Americans, were given in Oslo.

The prizes are approximately \$33,000 for each and diplomas. In the case of joint winners, the money was divided.

Gunnar Jahn, president of the Nobel committee, presented the awards in Oslo for Dr. John R. Mott, 81, of New York City and Orlando, Fla., Evangelist and leader of the International Y.M.C.A., and Miss Emily Greer Balch, 79, of Boston and Wellesley, Mass., economist and sociologist. Joint winners of the Peace prize, Miss Balch was not present.

King Gustave personally presented the awards here.

The 1946 chemistry prize was received by three Americans. One half went to Dr. James B. Sumner, 59, of Cornell University for his work in crystallizing enzymes, and the other half was shared jointly by Dr. J.H. Northrop, 55, and Dr. W.M. Stanley, 42, both of the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research, Princeton, N.J., for "achievements in preparing enzymes and virus proteins in pure form."

The 1946 physics award went to Dr. Percy W. Bridgman, 64, of Harvard University, credited with discovering dry ice, for his inventions of apparatus producing extremely high pressures and for studies "within the sphere of high pressure physics."

Dr. Herman J. Muller, 55, Indiana University geneticist, received the 1946 Medical Award for his discovery that X-rays may be used to produce mutations, or biological changes, in species.

**SECURITY, HUMOR MAKE HAPPY HOME**

LONDON, Dec. 12—(Reuters)— Security and a sense of humor are prescribed by Mrs. Geoffrey Fisher, wife of the Archbishop of Canterbury, as essential foundations of a happy home. Mother of six sons, Mrs. Fisher spoke in a radio broadcast.

"Home-making is not an easy job," she said. "Besides hard-work and sacrifice, it needs self-control and patience, but perhaps a sense of humor is the most important quality needed for family life."

Children needed a feeling of absolute security, founded on trust in their parents.

"There is no more tragic figure than that of a child who has been separated for the first time that his father or mother has let him down. At first he will make all sorts of excuses for his parents, but if it continues he becomes, callous and cynical.

"Many homes are breaking up because of a lack of truth, faithfulness and love in their family relationships. Children from these broken homes become problems because the security needed for their development was taken from them.

"The family is the best training ground for life, Mrs. Fisher said, because it represents the community in miniature; and the intimate family circle is the best testing place of character.

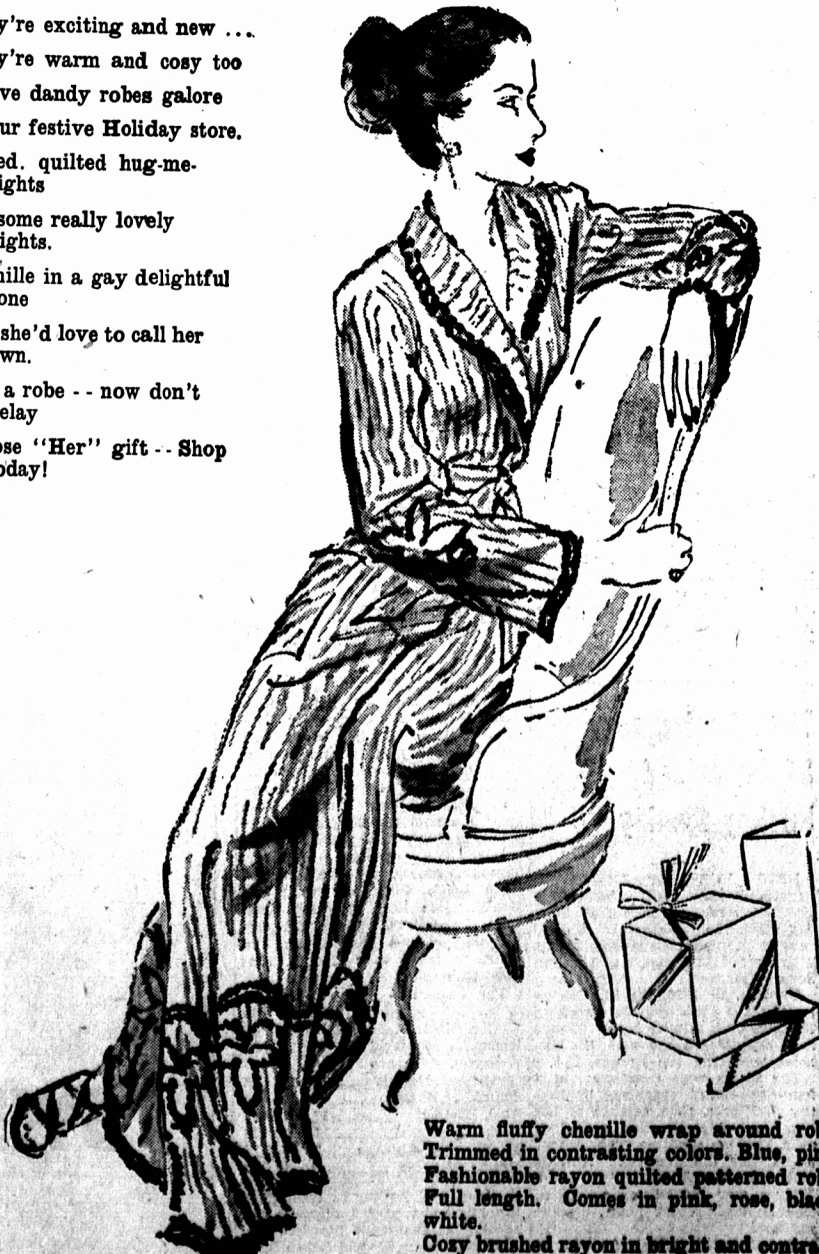
