Editorial Notes.

Several letters on civic affairs have been sent THE GUARDIAN without the name of the writer.

The St. John Telegraph comes to hand in modern eight page form, with increased reading matter and other features of improvement.

Col. Sam Hughes is now assigned a position in connection with Lord Strathcona's Horse, the despatches say. So far Col. Sam has received a different appointment about as often as Gen Joubert has been killed. Joubert still lives, and we are left in doubt whether Sam is appointed or disappointed.

A number of new cases of smallpox in Moncton and Newcastle, N. B. accentuates the necessity of our quarantine officers being especially active in preventing the spread of the disease to the Island. So little has been heard of late as to precautionary measures that there is yet a good deal of apprehension in the public mind.

As the course of the Tugela River is from west to east, how could Gen. Buller cross it at a point further north than his previous crossing as stated in yesterday afternoon's despatches? The only solution would be that he had crossed at one of the northward bends of the river, but this would not enable him to pass around the enemy leaving them on his right as the despatch in question states.

Our war news this morning tells that the War Office has no knowledge of any forward movement by General Buller, thus flatly contradicting some previous reports. All had hoped for better tidings, but it is well that we should know just how matters are. So far as is known all the beleaguered forces in Ladysmith, Kimberly and Mafeking are holding out bravely, and can probably do so as long as their food supplies last.

The occupation of the New Prince of Wales College building by the faculty and students marks an era in the educational progress of the Province. The new building is a substantial structure, apparently well adapted to the purposes for which it was built. It is by no means pretentious in architectural style, but forms a distinct and valuable addition to the number of our public buildings and is creditable alike to the Province and the City. It may be truly said to supply a long felt want.

THE GUARDIAN regrets to record the death of Mr. W. C. Desbrisay of Ottawa, formerly of Charlottetown. He was at various times connected with the writing staff of the Summerside Journal, and of the Herald of this city, and had been also Clerk to the Executive Council of the Province, in succession to his father, the late Charles Desbrisay. He was born in 1851 and was appointed to a clerkship in the Privy Council Office in 1894. He was transferred to the Public Works Department in 1897. He had been a good while ill and spent some months past in the hospital. Many friends and acquaintances will learn of his demise with sincere sorrow.

The death is announced of Governor Goebel of Kentucky. This is the result of a feud arising out of a contested election. Taylor the Republican candidate received about 196,000 votes and Goebel Democrat received 193,000 votes. A dispute arose and a commission was appointed to determine the result of the election. Pending their decision Goebel was shot through the lungs. The shooting was done, apparently, from the window of a hotel near the capitol, smokeless powder being used, to disguise the direction from which the shot came. The Republicans disclaim any know-

ledge of the crime and naturally profess abhorrence of a murder apparently committed in the patty interest.
