New Brunswick has now more than twenty "producing" oil wells. At Dorchester a company are making copper by an electrical process. A six million dollar company has been organised to carry on the manufacture of aluminum. Another company, called the Electro-Manganese Company has a capital of \$1,500,000 with power to increase to ten millions. Such are some of the enterprises that are now exploiting the mineral resources of New Brunswick.
