LIVE STOCK MEETINGS.—Live Stock Associations have been of great benefit to the live stock industry wherever they have been pushed with vigor. During the last year there has been considerable agitation in this province to have associations formed, and it is expected that sufficient grants will be obtained from the Department of Agriculture to enable these associations to do effective work. With this in mind every one who possibly can should be present at the meetings of the breeders which will be held as follows: The Horse Breeders Association, Thursday, June 19th, Dairy Cattle Breeders Association, Friday, June 20th, Beef Cattle Breeders Association, Saturday, June 21st.

JUDGING.—Next week Live Stock Judging Classes conducted by the Department of Agriculture will be in full swing. Mr. W. J. Reid, instructor in Live Stock Husbandry, will begin in Prince County and hold meetings as follows: Monday, June 23rd, Kinko on the church grounds; Tuesday at Augustine Cove on the farm of G. W. Cameron, Wednesday at Searle, Thursday at Freeland Station on the farm of James Cairns, Friday at the North Bedque on the farm of Jesse A. Wright, Saturday at Kelvin at near the school; Monday, June 26th, at Fernwood on the farm of Alexander Anderson. The meetings, with the exception of the ones at North Bedque and Kelvin, will begin at 1.30 p. m. At North Bedque and at Kelvin a Farmers' Picnic will be held in conjunction with the Live Stock Judging Classes and programs will be arranged and announced through the press. Robert Robertson of the Local Department of Agriculture, will begin his classes in King's County. They will be held as follows: Monday, June 23rd, Lower Montague on the farm of John Annear; Tuesday, Brooklyn, on the farm of G.H. Hume; Wednesday, Glen William, at or near the Hall; Thursday, White Sands, on the farm of William Machon, and Friday, June 27th, Murray Harbor North, at or near the Hall. All these meetings will begin at 1.30 p. m. It is hoped they will be largely attended and that sufficient stock will be brought in to make good Judging Classes. It is not possible for every one to attend the Short Courses that are held in Prince of Wales College, but there is no reason why everyone should not be present at some of these Live Stock Judging Classes which are being held throughout the Province.

MISSION WORK.—The special meeting of the United Baptist Foreign Mission Board on Friday afternoon in St. John was well attended by the members. Rev. Dr. J. G. Brown of Toronto, General Secretary of the Canadian Board, outlined the policy of the board in the future will be the education and training of natives in a larger degree than has been attempted. The Baptist Foreign Mission Board plan to raise \$100,000 in Canada for their work during the present year; \$45,000 of this amount will be raised in the Maritime provinces, of which \$20,000 has already been collected and with three more months of the year, June, July and August approaching, those in authority expect to raise the amount assessed with out difficulty. Dr. Brown left Saturday for Digby, Nova Scotia, visiting Prince Edward Island before returning here.

For many years Senator Stephenson has been an influential figure in the financial and industrial affairs of his State and nation. Of late years he has become a power in national politics.

Senator Stephenson is a splendid type of the self-made, self-educated American. His boyhood was spent in poverty. To-day he is the richest man in Wisconsin, being worth at least \$15,000,000. The bulk of his vast fortune was made in lumber.
