Thomas Harris, O'Leary Road, recently sold eight lambs weighing 1069 pounds, an average of over 133 pounds per lamb. They were all twin lambs, the offspring of four ewes. The oldest pair was under six months.

Potatoes still remain at stiff prices although commission merchants express the opinion that they will be cheaper very shortly. The price is expected to drop as soon as the potatoes begin to arrive from the Island in any quantities. By wholesale, potatoes in three bushel bags are selling for 55 and 60 cents a bushel and by retail they are selling at 80 cents a bushel. Since Saturday three schooners have arrived from the Island with potatoes, turnips, and oats. The schooner Minnie D. brought 2436 bushels of potatoes, 286 bushels of turnips and 1016 bushels of oats. The schooner Kestrel brought 2365 bushels of potatoes, 3297 bushels of oats and 532 bushels of turnips. The schooner Eliza Goreham brought 3,000 bushels of potatoes, 600 bushels of oats and 700 bushels of turnips. The price of turnips is still much higher than at this time last year but a decrease is expected shortly.—Halifax Exe.

A new record was made in the Every Day Club twenty mile bicycle race for the Dunlop trophy yesterday afternoon. Oulton, who hails from Amherst, did the trick in one hour thirty-six and four-fifths seconds, which breaks the former record of one hour and two minutes, made by Winchester, Charlottetown. There were five starters: Joseph Foote, Dartmouth; W. A. Moir, Halifax; Nelson Winchester, Charlottetown; T. C. Oulton, Amherst; and W. H. Smith, St. John. While going down Erin street, Foote and Smith collided with a wagon and Foote was unable to continue. Smith was able to finish but was too far back to have a chance for first. The order in which the contestants finished was as follows: Oulton, first; Winchester, second; Moir, third; and Smith fourth. The three head men were on even terms all the way out to Rothesay and remained in the same position until the Marsh Bridge was reached on the return. Then Oulton forged ahead and turned into Erin street, but Winchester and Moir kept on past the turning and when they found out that they had gone too far they turned back to Erin street. All the contestants finished in good condition.

There passed away at Valleyfield East, on October 17th, 1911, at the age of 79 years, Janet McLeod, widow of the late Malcolm McPherson, a sincere member of the Valleyfield congregation for thirty-seven years. She leaves to mourn five daughters and one son. The large number of carriages which followed her remains to their last resting place indicated the esteem and respect in which she was held in the community in which she had lived so long. The funeral services at the home and grave were conducted by her pastor, Rev. A. S. Stewart.

The funeral of the late Henry Fisher, City, who was drowned early Tuesday morning will take place this morning from his late residence Granville St., to St. Dunstan's Cathedral, thence to R. C. Cemetery for interment. The pall bearers will likely be chosen from the L. P. U. The body was found Wednesday morning, early in the morning a grapping party consisting of John J. Savdant, John W. Gormley and Benj. Binns, went out in a boat, John King holding the lines on the wharf, and began the search for the body. It was discovered just where the deceased had fallen in. It was clothed in a heavy rubber raincoat and heavy shoes. One hand was bound up where there was an old sore upon it. The body was removed to a shed near by and Coroner Johnson notified. After viewing the body he was satisfied that death was due to accidental drowning and did not consider an inquest necessary. The body was afterwards removed to Hennessey's undertaking rooms and prepared for burial. Deceased was a sober, trustworthy and efficient workman and his loss is deeply deplored not only by his own family but by his fellow workmen generally. He was 37 years of age and leaves to mourn a widow (formerly Miss McAtee) two children at home, Joe, aged 4, and Florence, aged two, also his mother, three brothers, James, Thomas and William, and two sisters, all residing at present in Maine. Much sympathy is felt for them in their sudden bereavement. The deceased was a member of the Laborer's Protective Union and their flag is flying halfmast over their hall.

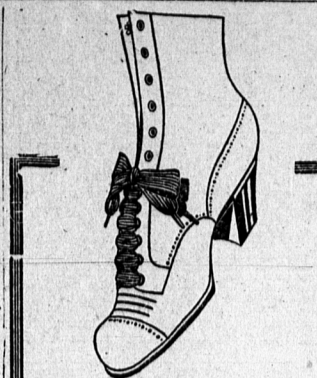
