The latest news, first of all. —In the Police Court in Summerside on Saturday, Thomas Brown charged with being drunk and disorderly on the streets on Friday night was fined \$3 and costs. Three others on the same charge not appearing forfeited their bail of \$5 each.

The auction sale of property and livery stable furnished by Chas. McDonald, Summerside, conducted by auctioneer Fred Wright on Saturday last was very largely attended and good prices were received for the horses and other outfits. The property on Granville Street belonging to Chas. McDonald was bid in by A. C. Saunders for \$900.

The police of Summerside did a rushing business on Friday and Saturday, no less than six drunks being gathered in and another drunk had a very close call on Saturday night when he was arrested on Water St., but broke clear from the officers when on Central St., on the way to jail. Two of the drunks appear before his honor in the Police Court this morning.

The motor boat races at Summerside on Saturday last furnished some good sport. Although advertised to start at 10.30 the races were not called on till the afternoon owing to the nonarrival of some of the boats. The first race called was class No. 1, citizen's cup, which had six starters. The boats finished in the following time: 1st Chat, T. B. Grady, Scratch, 1 hour 49 min. 20 sec.; 2nd Eliza, J. A. Rowe, 1 hour, 52 min. 55 sec.; (Handicap) H. M. and 40 seconds; 3rd Keltie, H. M. and 40 seconds; 4th La Tour, J. L. Sharpe, 1 hr 59 min. 30 sec; Handicap 2 min 20 sec; 5th Leader 2 hours and 6 min. (Handicap 21 min and 8 sec.) The handicaps gave 1st place and cup to Leader, 2nd prize to LaTour, 3rd prize to Chat. The next race class No. 2, Mackelvie Cup. This was the most exciting race of the day, the following boats starting at 1.15 with extreme speed: Imperial 2nd, Bruce Stewart & Co; Imperial 1st, McMillan Bros; Ruth, T. B. Grady. The course was twelve knots having three knots to each lap, which they turned four times. Imperial second had 1 min and 26 sec and the Imperial I. six minutes and nine seconds over the Ruth. On the first lap the Ruth led, Imperial 2nd by 32 seconds and on the second led by 41 seconds. On the third lap the Ruth's engine was not working right and she slowed down when Imperial second took the lead and held it to the finish. Both Imperial Second and Ruth had completed the four laps just as Imperial First finished the first lap. The Imperial Second's time 1 hr 4 sec. The last race, class 3, Fishman Cup for fishing boats had seven starters which finished in the following order, all the boats, starting at seconds, Scratch, J. F. Campbell 2nd, 59 minutes, 45 sec. (Handicap 44 sec.) Ed McPherson third; 59 min. 55 sec. (Handicap 44 sec.) Antoine Arsenault 4th, Hug Murray 5th 1 hr 8 min and 56 sec. Handicap 5 min. 42 sec; P. C. Gallant 6th and M. G. Arsenault 7th. The handicaps gave the race and cup to Edward McPherson, J. L. Sharpe, 2nd, J. F. Campbell 3rd. The officials were: Starter F. W. Peters; judges Capt J. S. Allen C. B. Morris, F. D. McDonald; timers Wilfred Tanton, L. R. Allen, Willard Muttart.

The Plan Gaining a Hold and Expected to Revolutionize Conditions on Many Million Acres. SPOKANE, Wash., Aug. 27.—Growers in several districts in India are about to adopt dry farming methods, and, although the plan may be slow in gaining a hold it is predicted it will revolutionize agriculture in that vast territory, which probably suffers more from drought than any other country in the world.

"Students of economic problems in India believe these methods will overcome the effects of drought," says the editor of the Herald of Health, published at Lucknow, in a two-page article commenting upon the fact that the principles of dry farming are being studied and introduced in India, adding: "And it is also believed that suffering from drought will be greatly minimized." John T. Burns, secretary of the Dry Farming Congress, which will have its fifth convention in Spokane, Oct. 3 to 6, says that the British minister at Washington, D. C., has taken up with the colonial ministry the question of selecting a vice-president and secretary from India for the organization. These officers will be appointed next year, thus giving India representation on the board. The congress already has fifteen members in India. That they are interested in the work is evidenced by frequent inquiries.

W. H. Bennett, of Ranigunge, Bengal, who has lived in India twenty two years, says in a letter to Mr. Burns that he believes millions of acres of land there can be utilized and made to produce large quantities of foodstuffs by the practice of dry farming. This, he adds will be of untold benefit to the thousands who are starving in different parts of the country.

"I desire all the information available upon the subject," Mr. Bennett says, "as I expect to take up dry farming and interest others in this country in the science of conserving the moisture of the soil. I believe it will be a success in India."
