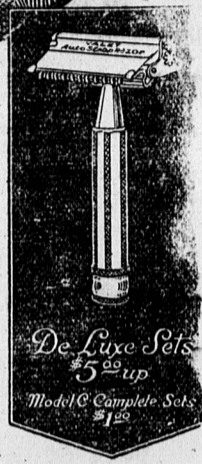

The Markets

(Canadian Press) MONTREAL, Que., June 14.—There was some business worked in Canadian western oats with the continent today on the Montreal grain market, but apart from this the trade was quiet. In the domestic market prices were well maintained with a little business passing in oats for export and country accounts. The flour situation was without any special feature, note, prices being unchanged with a moderate amount of business passing in spring and winter wheat grades. Prices for all lines of mill-feed were firm under a continuing good demand. A steady feeling prevailed in the market for standard grades of rolled oats and the market was fair. The undertone to the market was firm and the volume of business was good. The receipt of potatoes showed no improvement and the undertone continued easy. Carlots of Quebec white "B" grade were quoted at \$2.50 per bag and reds at \$2.10 to \$2.20 per bag of ninety pounds in bulk, extra. The trade in butter was again of a limited character and values were unchanged. The receipts were 620 packages. A feature of the cheese trade was the increased demand from English importers and a moderate amount of business was done in this direction. The trade in apples was also active and values were firm. Western grades were quoted at 17 1/2 cents to 17 3/4 cents per pound. The receipts were 8,100 boxes. OTTAWA, Ont., June 14.—United States cold storage holdings of eggs on June 1st were 3,060,000 cases. This is a surplus of 1,500,000 cases. Holding of frozen poultry in United States on June 1st were 61,488,000 pounds. Toronto—Dealers are quoting country shippers for ungraded extra delivered extras 25 to 27 cents, seconds 24 to 25. Extras are slightly firmer in a wholesale way and prices to retailers are extra 34 to 35 cents, firsts 32, seconds 29. A sale reported of a car from Brantford, extras 31, firsts 29, f. o. b. Delta 3 1/2. Montreal—This market is firm with good demand. Dealers are quoting country shippers extras 25 to 33, firsts 28 to 30, seconds 25 to 26, receipts are light. Regina—Dealers quoting country shippers extras 27, firsts 24, seconds 19, delivered cases returned. Vancouver—Prices here are unchanged and market is still weak despite the fact that two carloads were shipped to Montreal for sale last week. Jobbing prices declined slightly and prices to tailers have been reduced to sales. Extras are now selling at 28.
