Synopsis of Canadian North-West HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

ANY even numbered section of Dominion Land, in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, excepting 8 and 20, not reserved may be homesteaded by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section 160 acres, more or less.

Applications for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion Land Agency or Subagency for the district in which the land is situated. Entry by proxy may however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father or mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of any intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans: (1) At least six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if so desired, perform the required residence duties by living on farming land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (80) acres in extent, in the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this requirement.

(3) If the father or mother, if the father deceased of homesteader has permanently once on farming land owned solely by him not less than eighty (80) acres in extent in the vicinity of the homestead, or upon a home stead entered for by him in the vicinity such homesteader may perform his own residence duties by living with the father or mother.

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is defined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclusive of the width of road allowance crossed in the measurement.

(5) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above while living with parents and on farming land owned by himself must notify the Agent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing should be given to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa, of intention to apply for a patent.

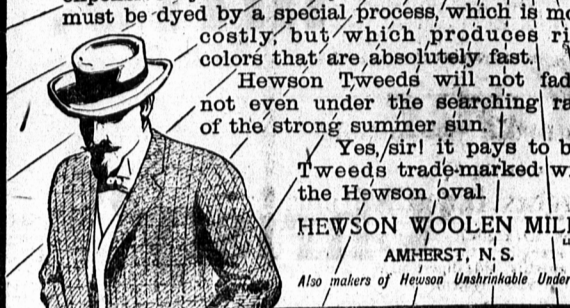
