The Minto arrived at Pictou at noon Saturday and the Stanley reached Georgetown at three o'clock. A special with freight and passengers came to the City at six o'clock.

M.P.A.A.A. SUSPENSION.—Bart Duffy, of St. John, N. B., and Michael Walsh, of Fredericton, N. B., are hereby suspended for competing in an unsanctioned skating race at Fredericton, N. B., on Monday the 25th of January 1904.

At the meeting of South African soldiers held on Saturday, a committee was appointed to make enquiries respecting a dinner for Paardeberg Day and to report to a general meeting next Wednesday at 7 o'clock at Mr. Mellish's office.

The formal opening of the new wing of the Charlottetown Hospital took place yesterday afternoon. Benediction was said by His Lordship Bishop McDonald assisted by Dr. Curran and the male members of St. Dunstan's Cathedral choir.

In Zion Church yesterday Rev. W. W. Rennie of St. John preached twice to large congregations. At the morning service he gave an eloquent discourse from the text, God is love. At the evening service his sermon was based upon Psalm 133 "What time I am afraid I will trust in thee." Both discourses were listened to with earnest attention.

The engagement of Miss Agnes L. Carr, daughter of Mrs. John de Soyres, to C. J. Glyde, of Ermelo, Transvaal, is announced. Mr. Glyde is director of public works at Ermelo. Miss Carr went to South Africa soon after the first call for teachers for that country, and as a teacher she has been highly appreciated. There will be many good wishes for her happiness.

THE death is announced of Mrs. McIvor, widow of the late William Graham McIvor, Esq., of Lushington Hall and Glenbrook, Utakamund, Madras Presidency, and for many years Superintendent of Chincona cultivation to the British Government in India. She was Anne, the eldest daughter of the late Colonel Edwards, Iscoed, Denlyshire, Wales. A woman of great sagacity and force of character she proved herself a true helpmeet to her husband identifying herself with his public undertakings and ably forwarding his aims during his distinguished career in India. After his death she erected a handsome monument to his memory in Utakamund and every year donated a sum of money for distribution among the poor of his native parish of Dollar, Clackmannanshire, Scotland. She survived her husband nearly twenty-eight years, having reached the advanced age of eighty-five at the time of her death. Her nephew the Rev. J. Graham McIvor of Yale University was for nine years incumbent of West River in this Province.
