## NO STRIKE BY THE WOMEN OF ENGLAND

The men who view women through the eyes of Schopenhauer, Otto Weininger, Sir Almoth Wright and their disciples must have been somewhat shocked by the simultaneous spectacles of thirty thousand English women marching through the rain to implore Lloyd George to employ them in munition making, and two hundred thousand ballot-casting Welshmen refusing to mine coal for the fleet. The men are taking advantage of the national peril to secure privileges which they could not obtain in time of peace; the women have disdained to add to England's burdens in order to secure their desire—the vote. Ninety thousand women already are engaged in farming in England, and the women demand that they be called upon to fill the places of the five hundred thousand male farm laborers of military age who still remain on the safe side of the Channel. Fifty thousand women work in munition factories, they ask that the number be doubled or trebled. Women have invaded all the Government departments, and in London last week four hundred men teachers were replaced by women. They are not striking or mobbing Ministers for the vote, but they are winning it in a subtler way. Women who have made shells, raised and harvested crops, run trams and bus-

nesses and stood independently on their own feet, have proved that they are a great deal too big to be confined to the ideal of the opponents of man-as-he-should-be in the household pet, half angel, half child. At the end of the war the women of England will come out of the factories retaining all the kindness with which they entered and possessing a fuller understanding of life. They will have proved that for modern woman the "burden of the ballot" is no greater than the weight of a cooking recipe.

## DESCENDANT OF A ROMANTIC HOUSE

ROME, May 10. (By Maine.)—The name of Beatrice Cenci flashes in one from the pages of a twentieth century newspaper, is something to make every art lover, every reader, every tourist stop and wonder. And the fact that the name of Beatrice Cenci of the twentieth century belongs to a descendant of an American family, as well as a descendant of the famous house of Cenci, adds new interest to this strange, stirring of historic memories in modern times. The newspapers of Rome chronicling the death of Donna Eleonora Cenci, Princess of Vicovaro, lady-in-waiting of Queen Mother Margherita of Italy, mentions as the orphaned daughter Donna Beatrice Cenci.

The newspapers, however, did not chronicle the story known to every Roman and to every traveller as well—the tale of the unhappy Beatrice Cenci whose sad face looking back from the famous canvas of Guido Roni in the Barberini Palace has kept fresh the tragedy of that young life through all the centuries. Princess Eleonora Cenci, who has just died in Rome, was the daughter of Lorillard Spencer, of New York. So the present Beatrice Cenci, the daughter of the late Prince Virginia Cenci-Bolognetti and his New York heiress wife, is part American. The twentieth century Beatrice who bears the name of this unhappy girl immortalized by Roni on canvas and by Shelley in literature, and in history by chronicles and by romantic stories, was born in 1877. Many of those who visited the piles of the old Cenci palace today do not know that there lives another Beatrice destined to a more happy fate than that of the ill-starred heroine of the sixteenth century who was born in 1577. The first Beatrice, who with her mother and brother was executed by order of Pope Clement VIII before Castle St.

Angelo, charged with the murder of their own father and husband, Count Francesco Cenci, is the most tragic and picturesque figure of medieval Roman history. Her beautiful young face with the sad eyes looks back through all the centuries from Guido's canvas, of its innumerable copies and photographs, in every country in the world. The story of Beatrice is quite as well known to the remote denizen of the western ranch where photographs and books have penetrated as to the tourist in Rome.

The Cenci family, an ancient one gave a Pope to the church back in the year 914. The name Bolognetti became attached to that of Cenci when in 1723 Virginia Cenci married the Countess Maria Anna Catarina Bolognetti. Through a papal bull the house of Bolognetti had been invested with the principality of Vicovaro in 1692.

Although the descendant of a romance and history laden Roman house the Beatrice Cenci of today has never forgotten that her mother was an American.

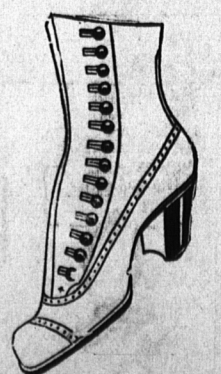
