BOY HURRIED INTO ETERNITY
FOR THROWING A TURNIP

Awful Act of Trueman Trefry, a Hantsport Man, Who Slew In Cold Blood Percy Corkum While Playing Halloween Pranks—The Man Said He Had Been Troubled too Long As He Saw the Boy Fall.

HANTSFORT, November 2.—On Saturday evening in this town the penalty of death was visited upon Percy Corkum, a fifteen-year-old youth, for the simple offence of throwing a turnip at the fence near the residence of Trueman Trefry. The penalty was not carried out by order of any tribunal, but it was the result of a self-inflicted death.

After the shooting Trueman, in a calm moment, made a statement that he had loaded the gun himself and had awaited the appearance of three boys who had previously passed his house, one of whom had thrown a turnip which had struck the window sill. These three boys were Percy Corkum, Harwood Zwicker and Harry Riley.

Trefry did not have to wait long for the boys. When he noticed them returning he crouched behind his fence, and almost immediately after young Corkum had thrown a turnip Trueman fired the shot.

FIRED IN THE MOONLIGHT.

It was clear moonlight when the shooting occurred. There was no wind, and the report from the gun reverberated through the quiet village. Soon the folk were astir.

It is quite evident from the facts obtainable that Trefry's act was a premeditated

deed, and that he shot to kill as the heart and lungs of the deceased were literally perforated. But very few shot from the gun missed the mark.

While the remains were lying in a pool of blood on the roadside, Trefry remarked:

"Yes, I fixed him. I had been bothered long enough and this fellow will tantalize me no more."

He expressed no sorrow for the life he had taken; and exhibited no signs of distress over the crime he had committed. He coolly picked the body up from the centre of the road and laid it on the edge to prevent teams from running over it.

RAN FOR THE DOCTOR.

Shortly after the shooting Trefry ran to Gertrude's butcher shop, where he found Dr. Margeson. He told him that he had shot a man, and desired the physician to accompany him to his (Trefry's) home, near where the tragedy happened. He did not tell Dr. Margeson that the shooting was fatal. The doctor hurried to his residence to obtain the necessary instruments for the extraction of the shot.

In the meantime Trefry, by this time half-crazed, repaired to the magistrate of the town and surrendered himself, and asked to be incarcerated. He again stated that he had killed a person.

The magistrate told Trefry to go home. After the departure of the man the magistrate detailed a constable to work on the case; a warrant was sworn out and Trefry was subsequently arrested.

CAUSED BY
SPOTS ON SUN

Strange Phenomena Occur In Various Parts Of the World—Electric Services Suspended.

LONDON, November 2.—Scientists attribute the recent magnetic disturbance here to sun spots. The worst effects of the phenomena appear to have been experienced in France, but Berlin was not affected and apparently neither Austria, Italy nor Denmark suffered. In Switzerland, however, there occurred the most strange phenomena. The telephone service ceased suddenly and remained suspended for half an hour, while the telegraphs were rendered intelligible and useless. In Geneva all the electrical street cars were brought to a sudden standstill and the unexpected cessation of the electric current caused consternation at the generating works where all efforts to discover the cause were fruitless. The meteorological office report a magnetic storm, accompanied by aurora borealis, in several parts of Ireland and Scotland. The telegraphic disturbance was one of the most extraordinary on record. Late this morning, before it had been settled where the disturbance originated, although Siberia was strongly suspected, a slight seismic disturbance was reported from the Riviera. Sir Oliver Lodge and Sir Norman Lockyer were interviewed on the matter and agreed in attributing the cause to sun spots and an increase in solar activity, which would also account for the unusual wet season now being experienced.

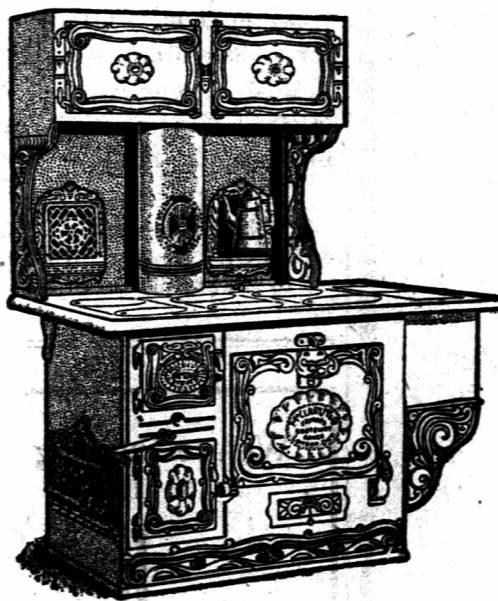
