REMOVING STAINS.

NOTABLE CASTLE OF THE NORTH

Lord Guilford, whose beautiful country seat, Waldershare Park, near Dover, in Kent, has just been entirely destroyed by fire, is descended from the second Earl of Guilford, who, as Lord North, was that Prime Minister of George III., to whose reactionary policy the British Empire is indebted for the loss of those American colonies which are now comprised in the United States. In fact, Waldershare Park was the principal home of that statesman, of whom Burke wrote: "He was a man of admirable parts; of general knowledge of a versatile understanding, fitted for every sort of business, of infinite wit and pleasantry, of a delightful temper, and of a mind most disinterested."

The Barony of North has since been alienated from the house owing to the fact that it is heritage in the female line, and went on the death of the ninth Lord, North, and the third Earl of Guilford to his daughter by Susan Coutts (heiress of Tom Coutts, the banker), to her son by Colonel the Right Hon. John Doyle, that son being now known as the present and eleventh Lord North.

But the present Earl of Guilford's eldest son is also known as Lord North, for convenience and in order to distinguish him from his father. As a general rule the eldest sons of Earls, Marquesses, and Dukes make use of the second title of their father until they succeed to the family honors. But the Earl of Guilford's second title is the Barony of Guilford, if his son were to make use thereof, there would be two Lords Guilford in the same family. One would imagine that it would be better for him to be mistaken for his father than for a distant Kiffinian, especially in view of the fact that young Lord North has no real right to style himself Lord North. This is what may be described as one of the anomalies of the English peerage.

The late Earl of Guilford was killed while riding in the Windsor steeplechases, in the same way as the late Lord Rossmore. The founder of the North family was Sir Edward North, a famous lawyer, who was Lord Chief Justice of England in the reign of "Bloody" Mary; and the second Lord North, his son, was the ambassador of Queen Elizabeth to France, and the treasurer of her household. The younger son of the fourth Lord North was Lord Chief Justice of England and Lord High Chancellor of the reign of Charles II., and his grandson, the third Lord Guilford, was advanced to an Earldom, inheriting at the same time the Barony of North from his cousin.

The present Lord Guilford is not very rich, and as a rule Waldershare Park is let to strangers. Recently it has been leased to the Earl of Shrewsbury's eldest son and heir, Lord Ingestre. But Lord Guilford does seem to have been occupying the place when it was burned down, and to have taken a very active part in rescuing the historic treasures with which it is crowded from cellar to garret.

TEXAS FAIR HAS SUCCESSFUL OPENING.

DALLAS, Texas, Oct. 18.—With flags flying, bands playing and a great display of enthusiasm on the part of the large crowd, the twenty-eighth annual State Fair of Texas was formally opened to the public today. The opening exercises took place in the auditorium where there were speeches by Governor Colquhoun and others. The fair will continue two weeks. The biggest collection of exhibits, especially live stock and farm products ever seen here, has been installed, and the race meet promises to surpass all previous ones.
