Rev. J. W. McConnell for the past four years pastor of the Methodist Church in Fredericton and a former pastor of Grace Church in this city, preached his farewell sermon yesterday and early this week will leave with his family for Sydney C. B., where he has accepted a pastorate. Rev. Neil McLaughlin, who is going from St. John to assume the pastorate, will take up his new duties next week.

The following will be of interest in Methodist circles in this Province:—At the preachers' meeting in Halifax last week, the ministers remaining in the city gave expression to their high appreciation of Revs. L. Daniel, C. E. Crovell, and D. B. Hemmion, who are leaving. The members of the preachers' meeting have worked together during the past three years with much harmony and sympathy for one another, and the parting is keenly felt by all.

Rev. T. Albert Moore, D. D., General Secretary of the Lord's Day Alliance of Canada, with his wife, reached Charlottetown Friday evening. They have been making an extended tour of the Maritime Provinces, Dr. Moore delivering many addresses, interviewing many employees, and investigating many conditions. He reports there has been a great decrease of Sunday labor, during the past few months. Especially is this true at Sydney, C. B., where now only about 50 per cent of the employees work on Sundays, and all may have one day off work every week whereas a year ago 75 per cent of the employees were working seven days in the week. Owing to local conditions there has been some change in Dr. Moore's appointments on this Province. He will speak on Monday, Brookfield; Tuesday, Tryon; Wednesday, Summerside; Thursday, Malpeque; and Friday, at Alberton. Next Sunday Dr. and Mrs. Moore leave for New Brunswick.

The farmers' institute meeting at New Glasgow on the 29th addressed by Prof. C. A. Zavitz of the agricultural College, Guelph, Ontario, in his familiar pleasing manner was highly interesting and instructive. The professor briefly outlined the work being done in the College where over twelve hundred students were present last year. Special mention was given the experimental work in testing the grains, grasses and clovers, single and in various combinations. In about two thousand plots annually. The Professor talked about farm crops and the cultivation and answered questions for over two hours to the delight of the audience.

Of the one hundred varieties of oats tested the Daubeny came first, Siberian second and Banner tenth in the list. The Daubeny is an early out of excellent quality and only about 24 per cent hull the O. A. C. 21, barley took the lead. In an average of eight years experiments, large oats had given an average of eight bushels per acre more than small seed. The beneficial influence of clover on the soil was strongly emphasized as results had shown that clover sod usually produced about 50 per cent more grain than timothy sod. After the discussion of growing potatoes, turnips, mangels, etc., a hearty vote of thanks was tendered Prof. Zavitz and gracefully acknowledged.
