

MANY MINERS ENTOMBED.

BIRMINGHAM, Ala., May 6—All hope that any of the forty-five white miners and one hundred or more negro miners, entombed in the mine of the Palos Coal Company, as the result of an explosion, may be rescued alive, has been abandoned. If any of the men escaped death from the explosion they were later suffocated by black damp.

GREAT EARTHQUAKE FELT.

SAN JUAN DELSUR, Nicaragua, May 5—Cartago, the Capital of Cartago Province, Costa Rica, was practically destroyed last night by an earthquake. At least 500 persons are dead.

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE.

PETERBORO, Ont., May 5—The death of Jas R. Bailey, the 5 year old son of James H. Bailey, of Smith, near here, will be investigated by a coroner's jury. It is said the parents are Christian Scientists, and did not call in a physician. After the child's death they asked Dr. Green for a death certificate. The case was reported to the coroner.

MIRACULOUS RESCUE OF TWO FISHERMEN.

HALIFAX, May 6—The two weather-beaten sons of France, who miraculously were rescued from a horrible death by starvation and exposure on the Grand Banks by the Lunenburg schooner, Nicola, Captain Zinck, have been landed at Canso.

WHERE NEGRO CHILDREN LEAD THOSE OF WHITES

WASHINGTON, May 5—The white man's educated ancestor has bequeathed to him a lot of afflictions from which the negro of today is free, according to the declaration of Dr. J. L. Minor of Memphis, Tenn., made to the American Pphthalmological Society, one of the constituent organizations of the Congress of American Physicians and Surgeons, which began its sessions here today.

A comparative study of children in the two races, Dr. Miller said, showed that negro children had a better average of normal vision than white children.


