Jubilee Addresses At Summerside Civic Celebration

Following is an extended report of the addresses delivered at the Jubilee Celebration at Summerside on Dominion Day:

MAYOR LIDSTONE'S ADDRESS

Ladies and Gentlemen—We are here this evening to celebrate in a modest way, a very important period or milestone in the history of our town. This is the sixtieth year of the founding of the first Civic Government for the Town of Summerside. This is not the exact date, but as Dominion Day, in this Province has always been recognized as Summerside's day, we thought it well to mark the event at this time.

MR. JUSTICE SAUNDERS

Next in order was Mr. Justice A. C. Saunders, who had been Mayor of the Town on four different occasions.

MR. W. E. MACDONALD

Mr. W. E. MacDonald, President of the Board of Trade, also spoke briefly and extended from the Board hearty congratulations to the Mayor and citizens on the 60th birthday of the town.

MR. JOHN E. CAMPBELL

Mr. John E. Campbell, next in order, was also born in Summerside, and his father, the late Ronald Campbell was Summerside's first Mayor. Mr. Campbell was Mayor three times in succession in 1920, 1921, and 1922, and was again elected in 1925.

MR. J. FRANK ARNETT

Mr. Arnett, who was Mayor in 1927 and 1928, spoke next and also referred to the early settlers who had built so wisely and well that the citizens today enjoy more privileges than many towns of this size.

MR. JAMES A. MORRISON

Mr. James A. Morrison was the first of former mayors to address the gathering, taking precedence in point of age and long service, having been Mayor of the Town seven times, four years in succession from 1910 to 1914.
