HOW THE EXAMINER WAS THANKED.

We yesterday asked of the Examiner three questions in regard to the thanks which it claims to have received from Mr. Martin. Our questions, and the manner in which they are met by the Examiner are as subjoined:

(1) In the letter as first submitted to our contemporary were there any thanks for the Examiner?—To this question the Examiner makes no reply, the obvious reason being that the Examiner was not included among the journals which Mr. Martin intended to thank.

(2) If not, how came it that the thanks to the Examiner appeared in that journal?—To this question the Examiner makes no reply.

(3) The Examiner denies having sought for thanks. Did it appropriate them without leave?—To this question the Examiner yesterday mildly answered "No."

We have then this probable condition of things:—Mr. Martin wrote a certain letter to the Examiner in which he expressed his thanks to certain newspapers, but did not include the Examiner among those whom he thanked. The name of the Examiner was inserted afterward. By whom? Our information, which is very positive, is that the insertion of the name of the Examiner was not made by Mr. Martin. And this statement by no means exhausts our information on the subject.

EAST QUEENS.

It was naturally expected that the Speaker of the Commons would speedily issue his warrant for a new election in East Queens, so that the constituency might be represented during the current session of Parliament. It appears, however, that the Judges who tried the petition against Mr. McKinnon have reported that treating was extensively prevalent during the election, and also that the inquiry had been rendered incomplete by the action of the parties to the petition, and that further inquiry as to the extent of corrupt practices in the election is desirable.

In consequence of this report of the Judges the Speaker is not at liberty to issue his warrant to the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery ordering a new election until the House of Commons has taken action upon matter. What action the House may take we do not know. It is within its power to make an address to the Governor General asking him (really asking the Government) to appoint a Commission to investigate all the matters pertaining to corrupt practices in the election, and if corrupt practices are found to have been extensive they may inquire into the previous election in the same constituency also. Whether the Commons will ask for a Commission in this case remains to be seen, but until the matter is disposed of by the House in some way no writ can issue for a new election.

The ice-boat service has proved quite inadequate and every day a number of bags of mail are left on the other side when the boats depart from Tormentine for the Island. It would seem that in such case one or more of the opposition boats ought to be engaged for the mail. No doubt the crossing has been heavy but when it is practicable to cross there ought to be boats and men enough at the command of the Government to have the entire collection of mail matter brought over.

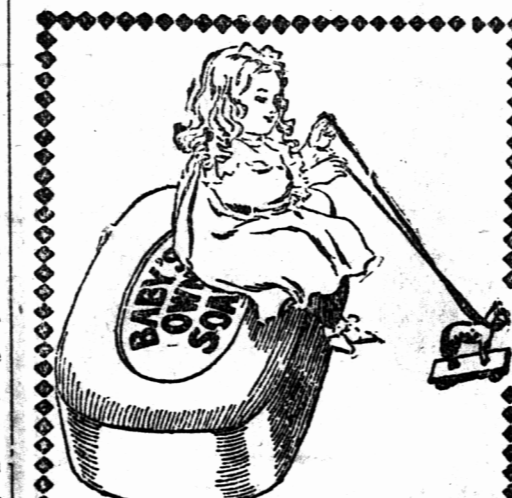

SORROWING THEIR LOSS.
