Gas Sold Automatically To Swedish Motorists
 (United Press)
 STOCKHOLM, June 17.—Stimulated by the rapid motorizing of Swedish highway traffic, native engineers have patented three inventions on the comfort and safety of motorists. These are an automatic beacon light for giving warnings at railroad crossings, an automatic slot machine for refilling gas tanks, and a device which prevents the accidental running out of batteries.
 The crossing beacon consists of a flashing light of cylindrical lantern with red and white sectors in opposite quadrants. When the railroad is clear the white lights go indicate to the highway traffic, but when a train approaches the lantern rotates automatically showing a red light to the highway and a white light to the train. This beacon will work under unfavorable conditions of snow and ice.
 The automatic gasoline vendor can be utilized by the customer at any time of night and day by connecting the tube with the gas tank of the car, dropping a krona in the slot, and operating a lever. The quantity of gasoline received naturally varies according to the market price, which can be quoted at the minimum, owing to the saving of wages for attendants.
 The attachment which automatically cuts off the batteries when the engine is stopped involves the principle of suction and gravity. It is essentially a switch system which is connected with the gas intake of the lubrication pipes so that the suction actuates a weight that rises and closes the electric circuit. When the suction stops, the weight falls and throws the switch open.

Bogus Medical Students Evade Laws And Enter U. S.
 (United Press)
 PHILADELPHIA, June 17.—Foreign medical students have hit upon a new plan to evade the immigration quota set by the United States, by a circuitous route which leads them through the back-door of the school room.
 Only by checking up the students' credentials with the closest scrutiny is the possibility of fraud in the quota being reduced to a minimum.
 This is the opinion of Dr. William Pepper, dean of the medical school of the University of Pennsylvania.
 "Bona fide students of recognized colleges and universities are not included in the quotas set on foreign countries by the United States and for this reason we have an increased number of students coming from war-ravaged territories. So universally is the status of a student held in high esteem that again and again we meet with someone trying to enter the country in that guise.
 "Only recently a young woman came here and, with tears in her eyes, asked me to accept as a student a young man in whom she had become interested and who was at that time being held at Ellis Island for deportation. When asked for his credentials, she told me they had been taken from him in Petrograd, and for that reason could not be produced. The woman had just married the man, and was trying to get him into the country as an 'accepted' student of the university.
 "This dodging of the quota and the increased influx of foreign physicians coming to the United States are two of the grave problems at the present time facing the medical profession.
