Pursuit Of Beaten Nazis In Full Swing

ROME, July 16 (AP)—The 8th army today captured Arezzo, 37 miles southeast of Florence, and poured tanks and infantry through the city in pursuit of beaten Nazis. Strongly-defended Arezzo, 37 miles southeast of Florence fell after a sensational burst of speed by the 8th army, whose progress had been held up for three weeks by a desperate enemy who lost heavily in men and material in a bid to hold the city of 60,000.

The weather again limited tactical air support over the Normandy front although medium bombers in extremely close support attacked German infantry on the outskirts of Esquay. The British drive, aimed at gaining elbow room for a new flanking offensive to crack the stubborn German stand on the Orne River, was described by a British staff officer in the field as "an undoubted success." He said the Germans were paying a terrible price in casualties for such counter-attacks as they put in near Evrecy today, and said the main German counter-attack was a trap, which the British "waiting and well prepared for it."

The sudden British punch carried through Esquay and rolled another 2,000 yards to high ground guarding Esquay Hill, dominating height between the Orne and Orne Rivers, and of the village of Lessay, five miles southwest of Caen. Lt. Gen. Dempsey's British and American broadsword Saturday predicted a big drive was imminent in the British-Canadian sector around Caen on the eastern end of the Normandy front, and a field dispatch from that area said German panzer units, now are ranged up in smokestacks in the factories of Colombelles, east of the Orne River and three miles northeast of Caen.
