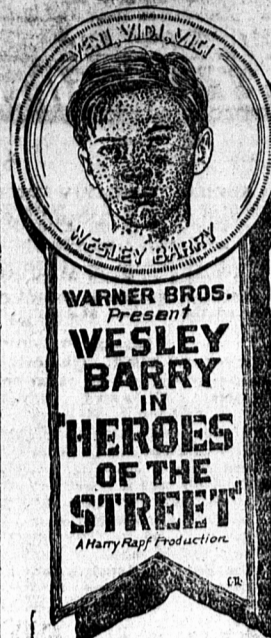

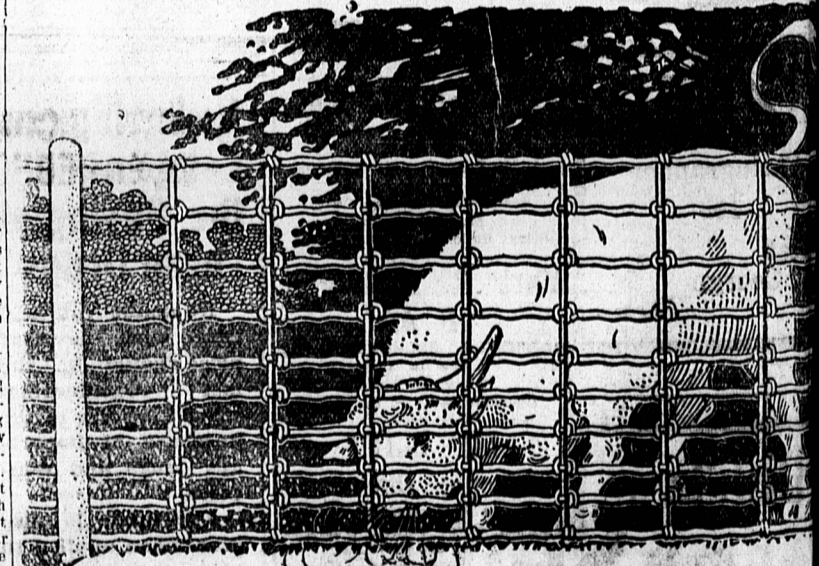

Mr. Bruce Dawson, Uxg, asked: Did the Egg Circles get the benefit of those collateral notes? Why was it that some of the Egg Circles received them back? Mr. Gordon MacMillan said that during the year 1919 Canadian Farm Products held all collateral notes and they financed the Egg Circle business at the Bank of Montreal. There were a few Egg Circle notes that were signed in sections where no Branches of Canadian Farm Products were formed, these Circle notes amounted to about \$8,000.00. Mr. MacMillan said there was no assessment made on them although they were held at the Bank. Mr. MacMillan then read a letter from Mr. Combs, Manager of the Bank of Montreal. Mr. Carmichael asked that if \$15.00 per member would still pay the debt if placed in the courts by the Bank of Montreal. Mr. MacMillan said that if a Branch was sued they will sue for the \$30.00 per member. Mr. D. Wallace McKay, asked if the books of the past year were

audited. Mr. MacMillan replied that they were audited three times. Mr. J. R. Munn said that he lost \$100.00 and that their Circle hands we can pay one hundred cents to the dollar. If there is a profit let us take it. If there is a loss let us bear it like men. Hon. John E. Sinclair, Honorary President, said that he had listened with much interest to the remarks made by the various shareholders and persons who are interested and said that a good

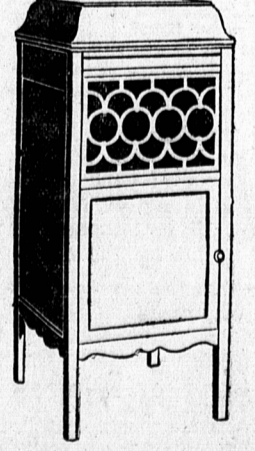

CHAMPIONS MUST DEFEND TITLES NEW YORK, Mar 27 - Another step to force boxing champions into action was taken by the New York State Athletic Commission today when it adopted a rule compelling title holders to go through with matches for which they had been formally challenged before taking part in any other contests in the State. Refusal of a champion to accept a challenge under these conditions, it was added, would result in forfeiture of his title claims in accordance with provisions of the Walker Boxing Law, which compels champions to defend their honors against challengers within six months. Three outstanding challenges, now on file, with the Commission, are affected by the latest decision. They are Carl Tremaine, of Cleveland, against Benny Leonard, lightweight champion; and Harry Willis, New Orleans negro, against Jack Dempsey, heavyweight champion. The Commission today granted a license to Eugene Criqui, French holder of the European featherweight title, who came to the United States to box Kilbano for the world's featherweight championship in a bout planned by manager Tom O'Rourke for the Polo Grounds on June 2.
