
...Murdoch R. McLeod was in Glen Martin on Thursday on a business trip.

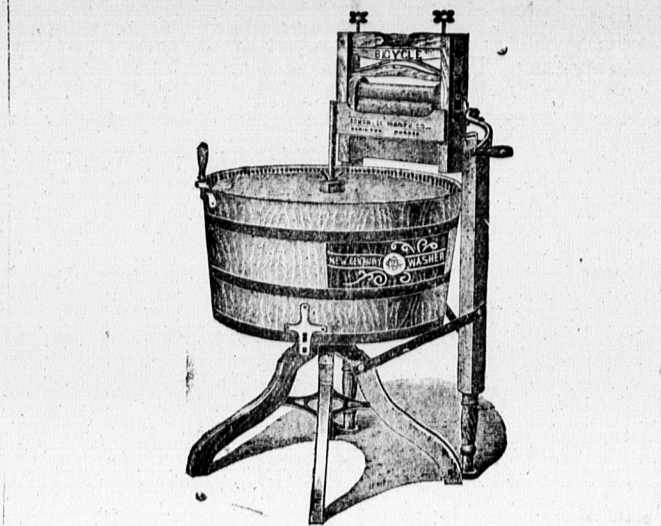
