ANTITOXIN.

The Way This Powerful Germ Killer is Produced in Horses.

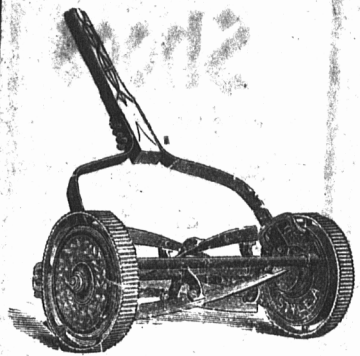
The recent triumphs of antitoxin over lockjaw have awakened a fresh interest in this comparatively new branch of medicine. If diphtheria and tetanus can be cured by such a means physicians predict that before long antitoxins may be used successfully for consumption, pneumonia and other diseases which are known to be produced by germs.

A horse creates the antitoxin for a disease by being inoculated with the toxin, or poison, which the germs of that disease produce. In preparing the antitoxin for diphtheria, for instance, the germs are first transplanted from the throat of a child to a sort of bouillon, made from chopped lean beef. Here the germs on multiplying throw off a toxin, or poison, which, when potent enough, causes death to any animal with whose blood it mingles. If a quantity of this toxin less than the fatal dose is injected into an animal the body of that animal generates in its system a peculiar product which destroys these poisons. This product is known as antitoxin. In obtaining the antitoxin for diphtheria from a horse, therefore, occasional doses of the toxin are injected, with intervals between to permit the animal to recuperate, until after several months of treatment enough toxin is harmlessly injected to kill several hundred horses brought in fresh from the fields.

When the bacteriologist believes that the horse has generated in its blood all the antitoxin that its system is capable of producing, he draws off a half gallon of its blood. A hollow needle shaped tube is thrust into the jugular vein, and the blood flows through the tube into an airtight vessel. Here the blood serum is permitted to rise to the surface, when it is siphoned off into small glass tubes, ready for the market, hermetically sealed and equipped with a syringe attachment and a hypodermic needle. All the various antitoxins are prepared in much the same way. —New York Tribune.
