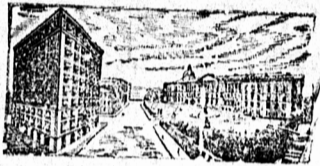

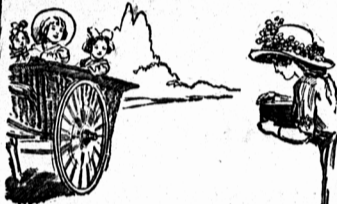

**A HYDROPLANE.**—Mr. Robert Irving shipped this week per Schooner Maple Leaf to Charlottetown the oldest looking boat ever turned out here. Says the Richebucto, Review, Mr. Amedee Legor, of the Marine and Fisheries Department Halifax is the designer. It is called a hydroplane. It will be fitted with a 40 horse power gasoline engine and is expected to run 35 miles an hour. The boat is scow shape forward and square aft, with deep lea boards on each side.

**CACOUNA TO DRYDOCK.**—Marine Superintendent McAlpine, of the Dominion Coal Company's fleet, is in Halifax in connection with the repairs of the collier Cacouna at the drydock, rendered necessary by her collision off Cape Tormentine last week with the North Sydney schooner Sarah A. The Townshend's cargo of lumber kept her from sinking and facilitated her beaching.

### HALTED WHILE ON SAD ERRAND

BOSTON, July 22.—Speeding in a high power auto toward a Boston hotel, where his daughter, Miss E. E. Beede, had just died under mysterious circumstances. J. Arthur Beede, a wealthy business man, was halted in a tragic way last night when his car ran over and fatally injured a boy in Chelsea. After taking the boy, Harry Somblosky, ten years old, to the hospital, where he died, the anguished father was forced to wait further while his chauffeur was arrested, charged with killing the lad. After giving a bond for the chauffeur, he was able finally to resume his route to that city. When he arrived at the hotel Mr. Beede learned that his daughter was taken ill in the afternoon and sent for a physician, saying that she was suffering from poison. The doctor had difficulty in entering the room and when he was able to open the door he found the young woman dead. She was 25 years old. Medical Examiner Leary said Miss Beede committed suicide by taking an alkaloid poison.
