Still believe that the steels and leading motors will continue to act well. In the low priced motors Hudson and Studebaker stood out in the last hour yesterday.

## GRAIN

WINNIPEG, Oct. 20 — (CP) — Mild irregularly prevailed on the Winnipeg grain exchange today, with the market affected more by weakness in outside exchanges than by improved export sales of wheat. The close was 1-8 to 3-8 cent lower. Sharp recessions at Buenos Aires offset the market stimulus of 750,000-bushel export sales. The October wheat future closed at \$1.12, November \$1.12 1-8, December \$1.09 5-8 and May \$1.10 3-8.

Cash-grains spreads closed little unchanged, with trading interest confined to No. 4 Northern wheats. Coarse grains prices moved narrowly.

## LIVESTOCK

MONTREAL, Oct. 20 — (CP) — Livestock prices held unchanged today on Montreal markets in light trading.

Receipts: Cattle 40; calves 418; hogs 909; sheep 234.

Common to just fair butcher cows brought \$2 to \$2.75, canners and cutters \$1.25 to \$2, common bulls \$2.25 to \$2.75.

Medium good veal calves made \$8, fair to medium \$6.50 to \$7.50, drinkers \$3.75 to \$6. Grassers moved slowly at \$2.75 to \$3.25.

Good ewes and wethers brought \$7.75, bucks and culls \$5.75, while sheep were \$2 to \$4. There were no early hog sales.

PERTH, Australia — (C. P.) — Western Australia established a record in the export of fresh fruit for the year-end, June 30 and for the first time exported more than 1,000,000 cases.
