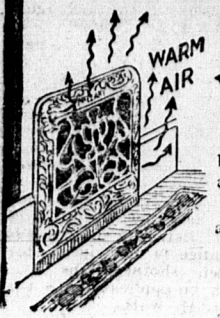

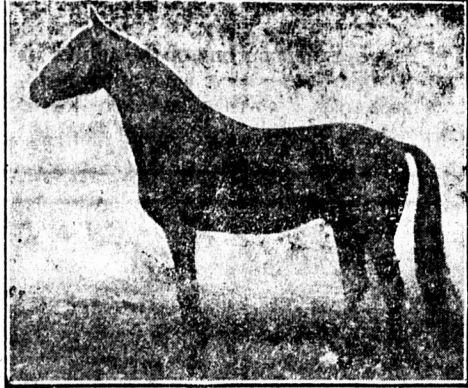

## Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 30 acres, father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of the homesteader in good standing may reside on a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties. Must reside six months in each of 3 years from date of homestead entry, including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate 1/2 acre yearly.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties.—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 1/2 acre yearly.
