FIND THREE MATTRESSES—Charlotteville police had three new mattresses at the station last night awaiting an owner. They were found yesterday at the loading ramp at the railway yards. Police expressed the belief that they were stowed by workmen unloading a furniture car. At any rate no break had been reported, Chief Birtwistle said.

ENTERTAINED THE SOCIAL CLUB—Miss Minnie Wright entertained the Social Club of Trinity United Church on Friday. After the regular business a social time was held. As it was the season for Halloween many wore costumes suitable for the occasion and the games and contests were in keeping with the season. Refreshments were served later in the evening.

FUNERAL SATURDAY—The funeral of Thomas Donovan was held Saturday morning from Frank Hennessy's Funeral Home to St. Dunstan's Basilica where Requiem High Mass was celebrated by Rev. Father Keefe. The pall-bearers were Messrs. Patrick Dennis, Robert Gallant, Benj. Sheppard, Edmund Stanley, Al. Ryan and Frank Doyle. The Labourers' Protective Union, of which the deceased was a valued member, preceded the hearse. Service at the grave was conducted by Rev. Father McCormack.

The success of Rev. Dr. Tompkins, one of the leading proponents of the adult education movement, in elevating existing conditions at Canso, N.S., and Dover, N.S., which were "deplorable" was a shining example to the whole world. Mr. J. A. McLeod of Reserve Mines, N.S., declared last night at a meeting of the Associated Study Clubs of the Redeemer Parish when he spoke on the adult education movement in Nova Scotia.

The residence of the Roman Catholic parish priest at Sturgeon was destroyed by fire early yesterday morning. Loss was tentatively estimated at least \$5,000.00, partly covered by insurance. All furniture and equipment was included in the loss. Details available last night were few but it was known that the fire, discovered about 3 a. m. yesterday, spread with great rapidity through the wooden building. A high wind was blowing. Origin of the blaze was believed to be around the furnace in the basement. The Rev. Finlay Mullaly, parish priest, awakened by the flames, had no time to gather personal belongings before the fire forced him to leave the blazing structure. The glare of the fire was visible for many miles.

The burned building was of wood construction and was built about 47 years ago when the Rev. William Phelan was parish priest at Sturgeon. Diocesan authorities in Charlottetown said last night.

GRADUATE NURSES ALUMNAE—The regular monthly meeting of the Graduate Nurses Alumnae of the Charlottetown Hospital was held at the hospital on the evening of October 11. After the regular business of the meeting had been completed a discussion followed on ways of raising money and it was decided to hold a bridge party in the K. of G. Hall. The nurses then resumed the discussion on the advisability of changing from twenty-four man-about-town to twelve hour duty, which had been brought up at the previous meeting, and left out to wait the opinion of the Medical Staff of the hospital. The Rev. Sister Superior reported to the nurses that the members of the medical staff with whom she had consulted about the matter were in approval with the adoption of twelve hour duty. It was therefore left to the decision of the nurses, the majority of whom were strongly in favor of the twelve hour duty system, and it was resolved that all private duty nurses, nursing patients at the Charlottetown Hospital, should have twelve hour duty only. This system to go into effect the first of the New Year and to be made a rule of the hospital for all graduate nurses coming in with patients. At the conclusion of this discussion the meeting adjourned.
