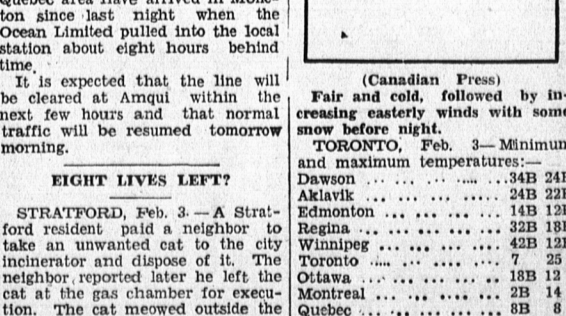
Flier Forgot His Passport
