THERE IS TOO MUCH ANNEXATION TALK.

Rudyard Kipling has written that "all white men are loyal." We can all agree that they ought to be where they live under an enlightened free government of their own choosing.

Just now there is an election campaign in progress and probably five hundred political meetings are being held on every week night between our Atlantic and Pacific coasts.

There will be altogether many thousands of meetings held during the remaining weeks of the campaign. Is this annexation bubble to go on through all these gatherings to the end?

The Canadian people are ready to forgive many faults and failings in their public men. A representative

may lapse from moral or political virtue, may lie and misappropriate the public money for his own or the party's benefit and it will be forgiven him, if he is a jolly good fellow, but let him be suspected of disloyalty to the flag of his country and he is at once beyond the popular pardon.

Is not this undignified, unnecessary, silly and perilous? It is a craze, an obsession. What must our neighbors think of us? A thousand orators in a thousand halls making night hideous as they sail the air and bellow forth their dread and fear of annexation.

And that is what it amounts to. No power on earth can change the flag of this country except by greatly superior armed force, and that at a cost which to use Kruger's words would stagger humanity, unless by the will of the Canadian people themselves.

MARKETS AND GATES.

The Examiner turns one of our illustrations about and supposes a case in which out of a hundred farms near this city only ten were allowed to send their products free into the market while the others were fined 15 cents on oats, 25 on potatoes and \$4 per ton on hay.

Again, The Examiner says we are not fair in our application of Kipling's line, "The gates are mine to

open; the gates are mine to close." It says "Canada can neither open nor close the United States gate." But this is just what Canada, under rare circumstances, is now about to do.

SOME BITS OF HISTORY.

So long ago as 1836 the Legislature of Upper Canada petitioned the Imperial Government for reciprocity with the United States in timber, wheat and flour, on the ground that "the price in the States was usually higher than in this Province."

"If the restrictions which embarrass our commerce were removed and we were permitted to direct the labor of our hands to the industry of our choice, to employ the cheapest and most convenient means of transport, and to carry the products of that industry to those markets in which they could be disposed of to the best advantage our means of purchasing British goods would be thereby increased and our capital and labor employed beneficially in diffusing wealth and enjoyment throughout the Colony."

shows the beginning of the reciprocity movement seventy-five years ago. It shows also then as now cheap transportation and reciprocity were regarded as inseparable boons.

But Upper Canada did not get the desired reciprocity, and the result was a considerable movement toward political union with the United States in order to obtain access to the growing market of that country.

And when in troublous times after the war of the rebellion the United States showed a disposition to abrogate the treaty, Sir John Macdonald most earnestly besought the British

Consequently there is an adverse balance against us. Take away those duties and give our farmers and fishermen the chance to compete on equal terms in the American market, and our trade will increase by leaps and bounds, the great prosperity which is now enjoyed under Liberal rule will be increased, and a new era of progress will be initiated.

Efforts are being made by the Conservative leaders and politicians to divert attention from this one great issue on which they forced an appeal to the country. They talk of annexation parade their loyalty, and enter into an unholy alliance with Mr. Bourassa and the disloyal element in Quebec. They seek to evade the one great question and to beg the electorate with very secondary and comparatively trivial matters. We appeal to you for support on the great question of the building up of the trade and commerce of the province, which will increase the prosperity of farmers and fishermen, which will bring employment to the laborer, man, work to the mechanic, increased business to the merchant, and vastly larger business for our vessel owners and for the handlers of our produce.

As proved by the Prowse election trial to which so many of you were dragged in by the Conservatives two years ago, the last Dominion election was a very pure one. We ask you to join with us in making the present one equally so, we feel confident of our election and do not desire to win by means of whisky or corruption. We will meet all legitimate expenses but refuse to be responsible for or to pay any bill for liquors or other illegal or undesirable purposes.
