Cooperative Food Production Plan

HAMILTON, Ont., Feb. 3—(CP)—A cooperative food production plan originated by R.E. Denman of the West Flamboro township and inaugurated in that township to meet farm manpower and equipment shortages has been placed before the Federal Agricultural Minister and may be made Dominion-wide.

Ella Gorman, Liberal Member of Parliament for Wentworth, said today that he has received word that the Federal Government will offer financial assistance to any County in the Dominion which wishes to take advantage of the scheme. Provincial governments have been asked to proceed with organization and if County may undertake its own organization with Federal assistance.

It is proposed that an office be established in each County with a paid manager to render assistance and the Federal Government will meet the expenses, Mr. Gorman added.

The scheme, under which groups of producers growing the same crops work together and pool labor and machinery provides the best method of meeting today's farm problems, Mr. Gorman said. Duties of the paid county official would include registration of city help to assist producers.

COUSINS FUNERAL SERVICES

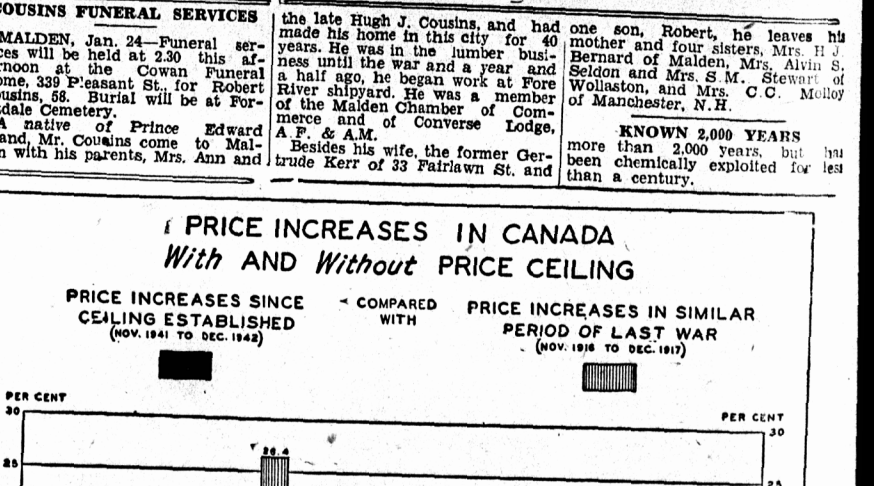

CANADIAN PRICE CONTROL IN ACTION

Figures compiled by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics show how the Wartime Prices and Trade Board has kept prices from skyrocketing as they did in the last war. Since the price ceiling became effective in the fall of 1941, the cost of living index has risen a total of only 2 1/2 points while in a comparable period in the last war it jumped 21 2/3. The chart above shows the percentage increases (not the point increases) for all items and also specific commodities.
