HINDU SHOTS IN COURT; HIMSELF SLAIN BY MARSHAL

SAN FRANCISCO, April 25.—Ram Chandra, editor of the Hindu publication Ghadr, was shot and killed here today, by Ram Singh, another Hindu defendant in the trial of thirty-two persons charged with conspiring to foment revolution against British rule in India.

Court had just adjourned for the noon recess. Singh fired two shots at Chandra, both of which took effect. United States Marshal J. B. Holohan who was present across the court room from Singh, drew his revolver and shot Singh, who fell to the floor. United States Attorney Preston had just concluded the prosecution's final argument to the jury when Singh, a member of the Ghadr staff, rose from his seat in the court room and fired the shots.

Ram Chandra and Ram Singh both were dead when examined by physicians.
