C. N. R. May Acquire Western Union Service

MONCTON, June 9.—Mr. Robb, Vice-President in charge of Telegraphs, Canadian National Railways, arrived in Moncton today in the course of an inspection of the telegraph lines along the Canadian National Railways in the Maritime Provinces and accompanying him is Mr. W. G. Barber, general manager Canadian National Telegraphs. Mr. Robb stated at the present time the commercial telegraph lines along the Railway right of way east of Moncton, are operated by the Western Union Telegraph Company and negotiations are under way for acquisition by the Canadian National of such lines and equipment.

Mr. Robb further stated "I am a great believer in the doctrine of "Canada for Canadians," and to that extent I would like to secure all the telegraph lines along the Canadian National in order to include them in our own service and thus complete the Canadian National Telegraphs with direct control from the Atlantic to the Pacific."

Mr. Robb went on to state that in 1924 the Canadian National Telegraphs took over the Western Union Lines and equipment in British Columbia and since that time there has been wonderful progress in the service, business has been excellent and everything possible has been done to maintain a very high standard of efficiency.
