## CANADIENS LEAFS DEFEAT ARE NOW IN MAROONS 4-2 3RD POSITION

MONTREAL, March 5—(C.P.)—For the first time since the campaign started Montreal Canadiens today were in sole possession of third place in the Canadian section of the National Hockey League. Moving into a tie for third position with New York Americans after a double win from the champion Toronto Maple Leafs last week, the Frenchmen continued their winning streak Saturday night with a 2-0 shut-out victory over the star-spangled Americans.

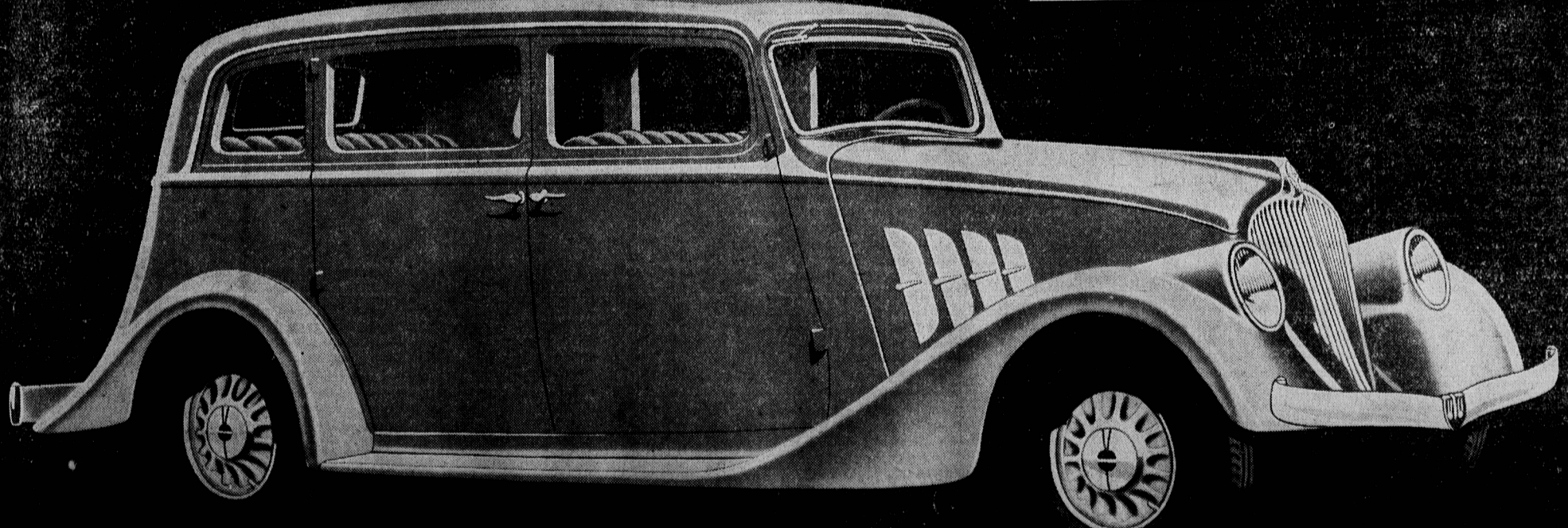
