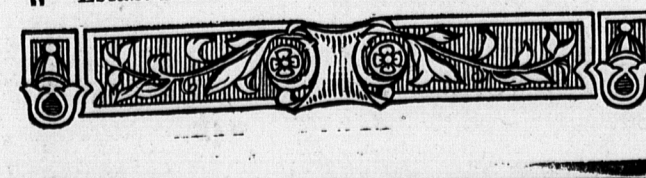



SOLDIER GETS A BIBLE IN HIS KIT.

MONTREAL, Nov. 19.—The National Bible Society of Scotland has just issued its quarterly report. Its work is international and the society has employed its colporteurs in France and Belgium while the society has also a depot at Lodz in Poland. The latter town was occupied by German forces, but when they retired the stock of Scriptures was used among the Russian troops. At the society's depot in Cassel, Germany, the agent was authorized to use portions of the Scriptures among the troops, and to send Testaments to hospitals. A number of gospels have been dispatched to the British Expeditionary Force and each Territorial under arms in Scotland has received a copy of a gospel.

The Y. M. C. A. and guild tents for the use of soldiers have similarly been supplied. A number of Testaments have been given to the men on board minesweepers and to the military and naval hospitals.

CODE WIRELESS BARRED. NEW YORK, Nov. 19.—Wireless stations have been prohibited by the Government from transmitting messages in code or secret language to or from individuals, warships, merchant ships and consular agents, according to an announcement made here by the Western Union Telegraph Co. Radio telegrams for points in Spain should be written in plain English or French.

GRAND DUKE NICHOLAS ORDERS PROHIBITION FOR ENTIRE ARMY.

LONDON, Nov. 19.—A despatch from Petrograd to the Times says:—"Grand Duke Nicholas, the Russian Commander-in-Chief, has overridden the decision of the Council of Ministers favoring the sale of beer and has now ordered that whatever martial law prevails the sale of alcoholic drinks of any kind shall be forbidden. This decision was taken because drinking among officers quartered at remote places had not ceased."

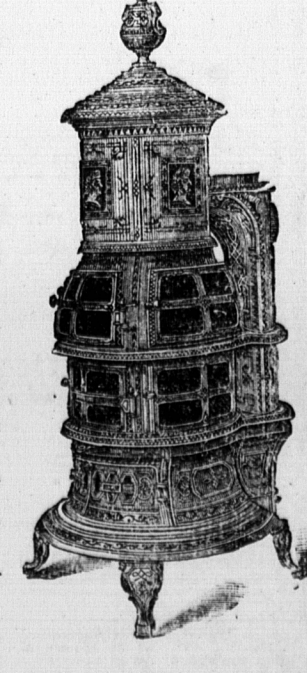
