ALLEGED INDUSTRIAL SLAVERY IN MAKING STEEL

The United States Steel Corporation is perhaps the greatest industrial trust ever established on earth. It employs armies of men, has a vast capitalisation of over a billion and a half dollars, and is highly protected by the national tariff. Recently a committee of the United States Senate has been making some investigation of the relations between the Steel Corporation and its employees and has reported that "a brutal system of industrial slavery exists," while in other respects the committee's report is strongly condemnatory.

There are 70,000 to 80,000 men employed by the Steel Corporation in Alleghany County, Pa., alone. Fully 60 per cent of these are immigrants, largely of the Slavic races. Most of them are unskilled laborers, few of them are citizens and the majority are unable to speak the English language. These conditions complicate the situation greatly and have given the management the opportunity of imposing great hardships upon a host of their workers, and such as are quite intolerable to free-born Americans. Mr. Fitch of the New York Department of Labor, detailed to the committee a conversation he had with a father and son on the ground, as to the outcome of the existing discontent. The father shook his head sadly. "There is no way out. There will be no change." But the son cried out through his set teeth. "Yes! there is a way out and it is through an armed revolution." A Scotch-Irish workman told Mr.

Fish of his work at the furnace. "Mighty few men have stood what I have, I can tell you. I've been twenty years at the furnaces and have been working twelve hour day all that time, seven days in the week. We go to work at seven in the morning and get through at night at six. We work that way two weeks and then we get the long turn, and we change to the night shift of thirteen hours. The long turn is when we go on at seven Sunday morning and work through the twenty-four hours up to Monday morning."

The Senate committee seems to be quite right in concluding that this is "a brutal system of industrial slavery." Twelve hours a day, seven days in the week, with no day of rest at all, but in its stead twenty-four hours of continuous work, must surely be beyond average human endurance. It is remarkable that even one man out of all the thousands was able to stand it for twenty years. Of course these men are paid, and are not bound to serve the same masters always, as the negroes were in the old slavery days. But the work of the negro slave was in many cases mere play compared with the tasks imposed by the Steel Corporation. Such industrial slavery is fitted not only to wreck the bodies, but the minds and souls of those enslaved. And it has become also a national danger, threatening an armed revolution. It will be well if the obvious remedy is applied by Congress in time to avert the otherwise serious and inevitable consequences.

PRESIDENTIAL CHANCES.

The bare possibility of a third term for Col. Roosevelt is revived in the minds of his ardent followers, after almost hopeless lagging, by his capture of the populous State of Illinois. The State is the most populous of any west of the Alleghany Mountains and will send 58 delegates to the Republican National Convention, of whom 52 at least will stand for Roosevelt. The press reports indicate a popular majority for him in Illinois of about 120,000 over Taft, and this may have an influence upon other States whose delegates are yet to be chosen.

It remains yet to be seen whether this is merely a sectional spurt or a matter of national significance. Down to a few days ago President Taft had secured nearly 300 of about 500 delegates elected, but they include many from the Southern States which are solidly Democratic. Much will depend upon the results in the great States of Pennsylvania and Ohio, yet to be heard from. Should they speak for Roosevelt he might yet have a chance to secure the Republican nomination.

The Democratic primaries in Illinois resulted in a decisive victory for Champ Clark over Governor Woodrow Wilson. Clark and Wilson have been the only Democratic contestants in many Western States, but Governor Harmon of Ohio is expected to show strength in the south and east.
