Says Boers Planned the War.

London, Dec. 13.—The last mail received here brings a letter from Theodore Schreiner, a brother of Olive Schreiner, who is as determined an opponent of the Boers as his sister is in their support. His letter states in the most unqualified terms that the present war has been planned with the object to overthrow the British supremacy in South Africa since 1882. "I met Reitz, now the Foreign Secretary of the Transvaal then Judge of the Orange Free State, when he was busy establishing the Afrikaner Bond. It must be patent to every one that at that time, at all events, England and its Government had no intention of taking away the independence of the Transvaal for she had just magnanimously granted the same. She had no intention of making war on the Republic, for she had just made peace. She had no intention to seize the Rand gold fields. "When I met Reitz he did his best to get me to become a member of the Afrikaner Bond, and after studying its constitution and program I refused, whereupon the following colloquy took place between us, which has been indelibly imprinted on my mind ever since: "Why do you refuse? Is the object of getting people to take an interest in political matters not a good one?" asked Reitz. "It is, but I see quite clearly that the ultimate object aimed at is the overthrow of the British power and the expulsion of the British flag from South Africa." Reitz answered: "Well, what if it be so?" "Only this," I replied, "that when that struggle takes place you and I will be on opposite sides, and, what is more, God, who was on the side of the Transvaal in the war because it had the right on its side will be on the side of England, because He must view with abhorrence any plotting and scheming to overthrow her power and position in South Africa, which has been ordained by Him. "My object in telling this is to show that the British Government, but the republics, led by Kruger, Reitz, Steyn, and their co-workers have been steadily marching toward war, and have been consciously plotting for it even before the Witwatersrand gold fields were discovered."

Parcel Post Regulations.

OTTAWA, Dec. 12.—The Postoffice Department has issued a bulletin to all Canadian postmasters calling their attention to the fact that under the parcel post regulations no parcel can be forwarded to Great Britain or any country with which closed parcels are exchanged unless duly accompanied by a customs declaration giving the name of the sender and the contents, value and weight of the parcel. The forms in question are furnished by the department to all postmasters for the use of the public. This regulation applies only to parcels forwarded under parcel post regulations; it has no application to packages of fourth-class matter (general merchandise) open to inspection circulating in Canada or addressed to the United States. The object of the department in calling attention to this matter is to prevent the disappointment which arises when parcels—especially Christmas Parcels—are detained for want of compliance with the formality mentioned.

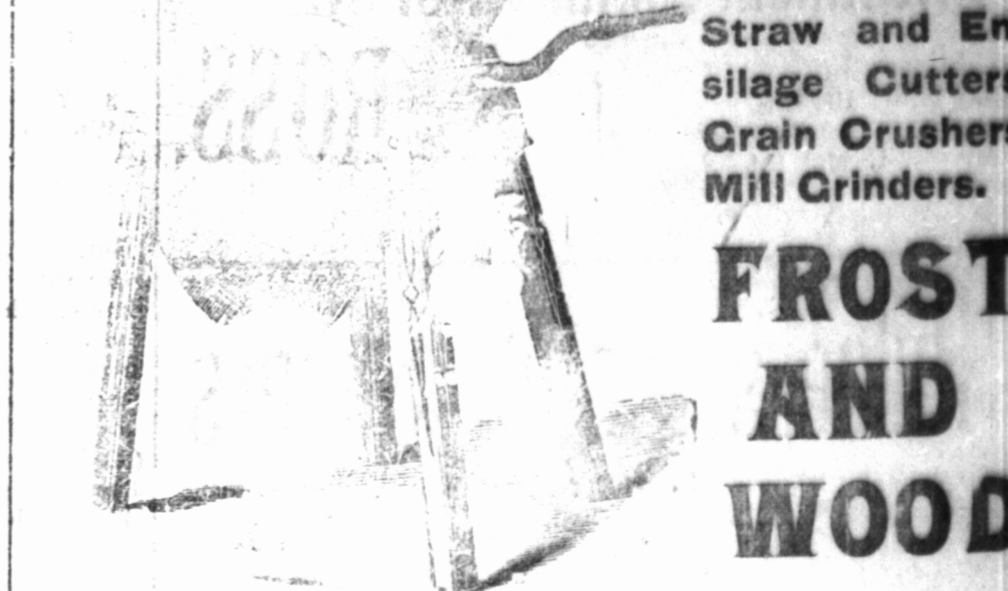
