### CAUTION ON THE YALU.

Whether something unexpected has happened, causing a change of Japanese military plans in Northern Korea forms the subject of discussion in a number of British and French newspapers. The war correspondents were some time since sent back from the front, and as very little specific information is permitted to leak out regarding military movements, the editors and military critics of Europe and America are left to guess what is going on. The London Standard believes the Japanese are fully aware of the enormous moral significance of securing a decisive victory in their first land encounter with a white foe, and hence are taking in secrecy every possible precaution and making every preparation to that end, and that this is the reason for the great caution displayed.

The St. James Gazette is as confident as The Times and The Standard that Britain's ally in the east is preparing a great surprise for the enemy, while the Daily News continues to wonder if the Russians may not become the victims of some gigantic mystification engineered from Tokio. In fact the leading British journals have great confidence that Japan's military program will turn out in a manner to reflect credit upon the generalship as well as the prowess of the nation. But the leading French and German journals see these matters through different glasses, and count with confidence upon Russia speedily overmatching Japan in the land conflict. They think the Japanese march northward has been unexpectedly delayed, and that the delay is to the advantage of Russia.

The Paris Journal des Debats think the delay in the Japanese advance to the Yalu is not voluntary on their part, especially as Japan has now full command of the sea. The Figaro believes that Japan's fleet sustained serious injuries before Port Arthur which have been concealed, and that the main army marching northward has encountered very serious obstacles and met with misfortunes. And it points out the great superiority of the Russian force in the cavalry arm. In this the Figaro and the Fremdenblatt (Vienna) are quite agreed. It is all summed up in the word "Cossack." South of the Yalu the Japanese are much superior force to the Russians on the northern bank, but this counts for little so long as insufficient cavalry prevents the Japanese from piercing the Cossack line. The Cossacks are holding the Japanese south of the Yalu, while Russia is mobilising a superior force at Harbin and other points in the rear, soon to sweep forward with resistless force.

Very terrible are these Cossacks in the eyes of the continental press, and their numbers at the front are being hourly increased. They are everywhere, and give the Russian generals full information as to the Japanese movements, strength, and probable intentions. They drive back the Japanese outposts and constantly menace and harass the advance, but without giving battle. Of that they have no intention. Their present mission is simply looking for the enemy, and when they have found him to cling to him, watch his every movement and give him trouble in a desultory way. In all of which there is probably a good deal of truth. The Japanese are relatively very weak in cavalry and mounted infantry compared with the Russians and the want will be increasingly felt when the real clash of arms begins. In actual battle, in covering a retreat or in following up a victory a strong cavalry force is essential to an army. The superior mobility of mounted troops as compared with infantry also affords a reason why the Japanese should be very wary and cautious in their advance against an enemy who has a vast array of excellent cavalry.

This is election day in the Third District of Kings, commonly called the Cardigan District, to fill the vacancy caused by the death of the late J. E. MacDonald. At the general election Mr. MacDonald's majority over Thomas Kitchman was 53. A pretty close contest is expected as both the party organs admit that the result is doubtful. We shall give the returns in The Guardian of tomorrow.

Rev. Mr. Raymond has made for himself a large place in the Christian activity of Prince Edward Island, and will be proportionately missed hereafter, while the best wishes of all the evangelical churches will follow him and Mrs. Raymond to their new home in Nova Scotia.
