**ENTERTAIN VISITORS.** - An enjoyable dance in Smallwood's Hall was held by the Friday night class on Tuesday night. **HANDSOME MEMORIAL.** - The Light Horse are having erected a handsome monument over the grave of their departed comrade Major McDonald. The work of art was done by Messrs. Chandler & Bell, Stonecutters. The base of the monument is of freestone 2 ft. 5 in. x 2 ft. 5 in., on which is a second base of marble 2 ft. 2 in. x 2 ft. 2 in. and 10 inches thick. On this rests the die or main portion of the monument which measures 1 ft. 5 in. x 1 ft. 5 in., and on which is the following inscription: "Erected by the Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and Men of the R. I. Light Horse as a tribute of respect to the memory, and to mark the last resting place of the remains of their late commanding officer, Major John A. McDonald, who died Aug. 28, 1911, aged 30 years." Surmounting the whole is a broken column 5 feet high and 11 in. x 11 in. at the base. The monument will be placed in position as soon as the weather clears up.

**INSTITUTE MEETING.** - The very unfavorable weather of Monday did not in any way affect the attendance of the Cornwall and York Point Women's Institute. The meeting was held in the afternoon at the home of Mrs. Donald Murchison, York Point, when there were thirty ladies present from as many as four of the surrounding districts.
