VANCOUVER, B. C., Oct. 3.—A \$10,000,000 merger of all the powder companies in Canada, except the Giant Powder Company's branch factory at Telegraph Bay, has been effected.

HON. J. K. WARD DEAD.

MONTREAL, Oct. 2.—The death took place today of the Hon. J. K. Ward, a member of the Legislative Council, aged 91 years, and a very large and successful merchant in his time. He contested Ste. Antoine Division for Montreal West, twice in the Liberal interest, but was defeated.

ITALIAN CHOLERA REPORT.

ROME, Oct. 2.—An official bulletin issued last evening gives the following report, covering the past twenty-four hours in the cholera infected district: "Naples City, 11 deaths and 18 new cases; Naples Province, one death and 9 new cases; Salerno province, one death and one new case; Caserta, two new cases; Sassari province, one death and four new cases, and Apulia province, three deaths and four new cases."

OTTAWA, Oct. 2.—The only important application of which notice is given in to-day's Canada Gazette is one by the Canadian Light and Power Co., to the Governor-in-Council for approval of its project of the proposed work in connection with the crossing of the River Chateaugay at Chateaugay, Que., with its transmission lines.

PORTLAND, Oct. 4.—Because his wife set for a policeman when he had come home drunk and thrown her out of the house, Albert Fowartschney sent a charge of shot into her side, and going to a field nearby blew his head off with the same gun. The shot penetrated the woman's side. She may recover.

DEATH-DEALING CYCLONE SWEEPS OVER MONTREAL.

MONTREAL, October 2.—Two men were killed, two seriously injured and a vast amount of damage done in the city on Saturday by a fifteen minute cyclone which provided about the severest storm of its kind. Montreal has seen in many years. The storm broke about one o'clock with a gale accompanied by heavy rain and severe lightning.

BOSTON, Oct. 2.—Finishing the last of her builders acceptance trial tests, a four hour run at upwards of 29.50 knots an hour, the torpedo boat destroyer Perkins arrived in this harbor today, from Rockland, Me., the naval trial board which has supervised the several trials of the past week, declared when they landed that the Perkins had fulfilled every requirement and would be ready to go into commission, probably in three weeks.

SUIT ENTERED FOR SOTHERN DIVORCE.

RENO, Nevada, October 1.—Virginia Harned Sothern, the actress has filed suit for divorce, against Edward H. Sothern, the actor. Mrs. Sothern alleges that Sothern deserted her in 1906, ten years after their marriage, at Philadelphia, and that since that time he has failed to contribute to her support. This is the second suit for divorce filed by Mrs. Sothern.

Two years ago she began an action but the decree was denied on account of Mrs. Sothern having never resided in Nevada.

QUEEN'S OWN IN MOURNING.

TORONTO, October 1.—Wireless messages received via Fame Point from the 8th Bn. Canada, on which the Queen's Own Rifles are returning to Canada, say the regiment expects to arrive at Quebec on Saturday, taking a special train direct for Toronto and reaching home Sunday evening about nine o'clock.

The regiment's despatches say, mourn the death of Lieut. Gzowski, of which they had just heard by wireless from London. The arrangement for the civic reception to the Q. O. R. have been based on the assumption that the regiment would not reach the city until Monday. They are elastic enough, however, to permit of change being made so soon as there is any assurance as to the time of the regiment's arrival.

A TERRIBLE DISASTER.

PANAMA, Oct. 4.—The steamer Chirique, belonging to the Pacific Navigation Co. plying between Panama and Benture, is reported lost by an explosion of her boilers off Garachirre in the Gulf of Panama.

POTATO FAMINE IN WINNIPEG.

WINNIPEG, Sept. 29.—A potato famine is already in sight in Winnipeg, and there is a general shortage of other vegetables. Market gardeners have not had such poor returns in fifteen years. Potatoes are now quoted at 90 cents per bushel. Heavy importations from the east will be necessary.

The extraordinary weather conditions of this year still obtain. Three nights ago, ten degrees of frost were registered, while last evening the thermometer was over seventy after a very sultry day.
