TO ISSUE BADGES

Civilian badges identifying men honorably discharged from the armed services during the present war and those who have been refused enlistment because they lacked the required qualifications, will be issued by national defence headquarters. 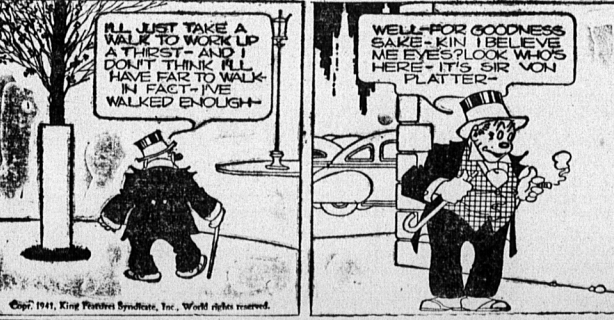

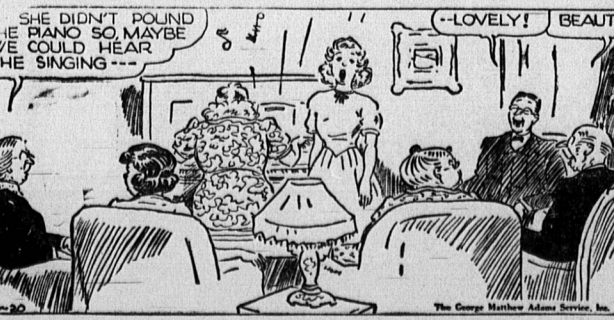

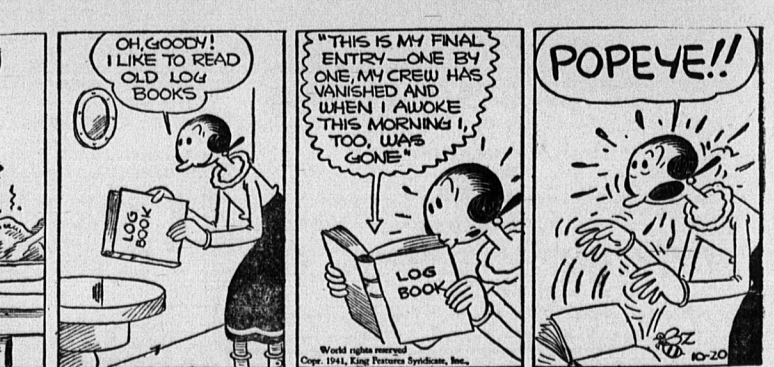
