\$674,147 LIES UNCLAIMED IN BANKS OTTAWA, Nov. 27.—A blue book tabled in the Commons yesterday, giving a list of unclaimed balances in Canadian banks, shows that some thousands of depositors throughout Canada have for some reason or another left with the banks a total of \$674,147, to which no one has laid claim for two years.

The unclaimed balances run from a few cents up to several thousand dollars, over a score being two thousand and several being in the neighborhood of five thousand dollars.

PERMANENT CHAIRMAN OF LIBERAL CAUCUS.

OTTAWA, Nov. 27.—Dr. Clark, of Red Deer, Alta., was today chosen by the Liberal caucus as permanent chairman. According to a statement issued afterwards only organizer work was dealt with at the meeting.

HOMING PIGEONS STOP CITY CLOCK.

GREENSBURG, Pa., Nov. 27.—Two homing pigeons exhausted by a thousand mile flight from Hays City, Kan., to the home of their owner Harry Leyh near Jeannette fluttered onto the courthouse tower this morning and being unable to find foothold on the slate roof slipped down until they rested on the minute hand of the big clock which furnishes the city's official time.

It was fifteen minutes to eight o'clock when the birds perched on the minute hand and for three hours they sat there stopping the clock. At a quarter to eleven o'clock apparently having recovered their strength they rose gracefully in the air circled and flew straight as a plummet for the Leyh home two miles away. They made their haven in six minutes. Both birds were in a state of collapse.

Mr. Leyh said the birds had been liberated in Hays City November 13. During the time the birds were perched on the minute hand of the clock in attendant at the Court House climbed up in the tower. He said they appeared exhausted he could have shaken them off the big hand had he so desired.

HAS 42 POUNDS OF METAL IN HIS BODY. MONTREAL, Nov. 27.—Britain had her Iron Duke, but Montreal is not far behind. There arrived from New York an iron man in every sense of the word. James Thompson has forty-two pounds of iron, steel and other metals in his body. He is probably the only man in the world who can say that he is as strong and alive after having lost the majority of his joints and eight major bones.

He was in a bad plight when James Thompson when he fell from a span on the Quebec bridge, on which he was working three days previous to the collapse of the structure. Mr. Thompson dropped over two hundred feet into the river, and when rescued was found to have every major bone in his body broken. So the inconspicuous workman was hustled off to New York to be used for experimentation purposes at St. Luke's Hospital. The house surgeons there took charge of him and proceeded to patch him up. After three years he is back in Canada looking for a job.
