Redistribution Measure Discussed By Justice Minister

Of general interest is the following statement made by Rt. Hon. L. St. Laurent, Minister of Justice in the House of Commons on May 23 regarding readjustment of representation in the House.

Mr. St. Laurent: "The Government has come to the conclusion to recommend to parliament the adoption of a bill to amend the Constitution of the United Kingdom to provide for the appeal of section 51 of the British North America Act as it now stands and to substitute therefor the provisions which are printed in the enclosed copy of the Routine Proceedings of this day. I do not think it is necessary to take time to read the bill to read the text of section 51 as it is now in force."

"I think that it is familiar to all members of the House who know the original principle of representation that it provides for a fair and equitable representation of the population of each of the other provinces shall be determined by dividing the population of each province by five to get a quotient and by using that quotient to divide the population of the province to be represented."

"If that were done for it and all that was provided for in the Constitution, the result would be that Prince Edward Island would have two members; Nova Scotia would have eleven; New Brunswick would have sixteen; Ontario would have sixteen; Quebec would have sixteen; Manitoba would have sixteen; Saskatchewan would have sixteen; Alberta would have sixteen; British Columbia would have sixteen; and the Yukon Territory would have sixteen."
