Governor General In Boston

BOSTON, Dec. 10—The thousands of Canadians in Greater Boston—more it is said than in any other American city—who have been agog the past week or so over the approaching visit of the Governor-General of Canada and Viscountess Willingdon are due to suffer some disappointment. This damper on Canadian spirits has been occasioned by the announcement that, outside of Washington, Their Excellencies' visit to the United States will be strictly private and unofficial in character. In the American capital, as the press dispatches already have told, the Governor-General and his Lady were received with royal honors as befitting the King's representative in Canada.

However, according to Hon. Edward P. Gray, British Consul-General in Boston, Lord Willingdon is of the opinion that as the Hon. Vincent Massey is the King's only accredited representative in the United States, it would be inappropriate for him to travel in this country, outside of Washington, in his official capacity as Governor-General of the Dominion. Following discussion of the matter between Mr. Massey and Mr. Gray, it was decided to accede to Lord Willingdon's request that nothing in the way of an official reception be accorded him in Boston. The same procedure will be observed in New York.

Therefore when the Governor-General with his party arrives in the metropolis of New England on Dec. 12 it will be only as Viscount Willingdon, a distinguished member of the British House of Lords, on a private visit to the city. Thus it is that Canadians who had hoped to greet the viceroy and do him honor as such officially through their organization, the Canadian Club of Boston, will be disappointed. It is to be hoped sincerely that His Excellency will "take the will for the deed," as no doubt he will. On his arrival here Lord Willingdon's aides will be in mufti and Mr. Gray says that he has even been advised against meeting the Governor-General's party at the station for fear that some misapprehension as to the character of the visit may be occasioned thereby.

As a result of the Governor-General's decision very little in the way of an itinerary has been arranged covering his stay in Boston. He will arrive some time during the forenoon of Monday, Dec. 12th and will leave on Wednesday, Dec. 14th. It already has been announced in the Boston press that he will pay a courtesy call on Governor Fuller at 3.30 p. m. the same day. Owing to the change in the character of his visit this call may not be at the Massachusetts State capital, but at the Governor's residence at 150 Beacon Street. While in Boston Lord and Lady Willingdon will be the guest of Mrs. Edwin S. Webster, whose home is at 307 Dartmouth Street.

On Monday at 4.30 o'clock, the English-Speaking Union will give a reception and tea in honor of Their Excellencies at the Hotel Ritz-Carlton. To this the president of the Canadian Club, Mr. James H. Morson and a number of other prominent Canadians, besides others interested, have been invited. This is the only definite engagement that Lord Willingdon has made to date and it will be the only opportunity Canadians will have to greet him, unless they are successful in wheeling him to their club rooms at some time during his stay. The legion of Canadians in Greater Boston will be disappointed that they will not have an opportunity to welcome Canada's Governor-General. Some of them will have the pleasure of meeting Viscount Willingdon, distinguished British nobleman, privately, and it is certain that in his person they will find borne out the good reports that have preceded the Governor-General from across the northern border.
