**Stock Markets At A Glance**

**WINNIPEG, Dec. 4 (CP)**—United States buyers were credited with taking 100,000 bushels of Canadian oats today on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange. Shipment made direct from country points all rail to Duluth, Minn.

**TORONTO, Dec. 4 (CP)**—Stocks moved in the heaviest volume since September 20 today on the Toronto Exchange and prices closed higher for the Basic Metals and western oils. Good issues were practically unchanged at the close so far as the leaders were concerned but some of the junior issues were well up for the day on heavy volume.

**CHICAGO, Dec. 4 (AP)**—A flatter undertone developed in grain futures markets near the close today with corn and rye showing gains of a cent or more. The fall was light and prices were affected by comparatively small orders.

**MONTREAL, Dec. 4 (CP)**—Papers paced most of the groups on the Montreal Exchange and Curb Market into higher ground in transactions today. Papers jumped 5.95 to a new top in the indices and industrial and combines were also at new peaks. Volume was the best since July 5.

**LONDON, Dec. 4 (CP-Reuters)**—A renewed strength of activity in British securities markets was the chief feature of the Stock Markets today. The fall was light and prices were affected by comparatively small orders.

**NEW YORK, Dec. 4 (AP)**—Led by rails, steels and selected industrials, the Stock Market registered many 7-year highs today with gains of fractions to more than 2 points on one of the largest turnovers of the past six months.
