**IN MEMORIAM**

**WALLACE LOWRY**

On Saturday last, there passed peacefully away at the City Sanatorium, Cambridge, Mass., Wallace Lowry at the age of thirty three years. After a severe illness of about two months duration, borne with calm resignation, the young man entered happily into rest. The deceased was born at St. Catharines, P. E. I., the youngest son of the late Mr. and Mrs. David Lowry and as a veteran of the world war he had enlisted with a battalion from his native province and served overseas with the C. E. F. Some seven or eight years ago he moved to Cambridge, where he has resided ever since. Wallace was popular with his many friends and associates in the community and in the congregation of the Scottish Kirk of which he was a member. The funeral, which took place on Monday afternoon from the residence of his friends, Mr. and Mrs. Hubert MacLean, of Alliston, Mass., was largely attended, services being conducted by his pastor, Rev. J. W. S. Lowry, at the house, and at the place of interment in Glenwood Cemetery, Everett, Mass. He leaves to mourn for him, two brothers, John, of St. Catharines, P. E. I., and David, of Quincy, Mass., one sister, Mrs. A. Laforet, of Mansfield, Mass.
