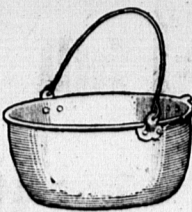

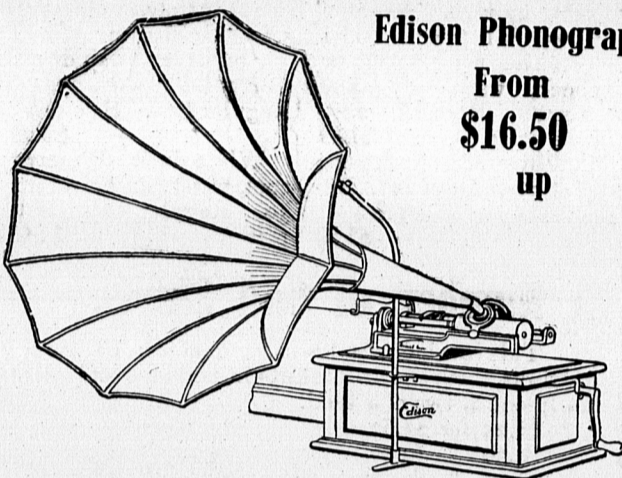

—The City of Ghent was in Summerside yesterday. She discharged three hundred barrels flour, 150 lbs sugar and a lot of oil and took on board one thousand bags potatoes, besides the usual sundries.

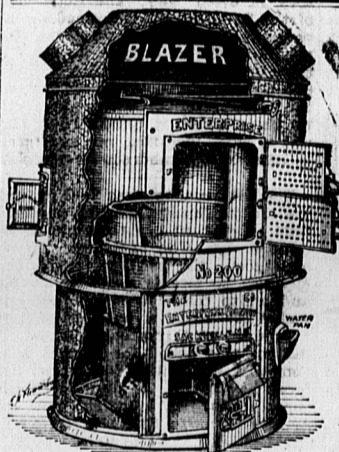
