WELL PLEASED—The Halifax Oddfellows who attended the grand lodge meeting at Charlottetown arrived home last night delighted with their trip and reception on the Island. They say it was the largest grand lodge meeting held for years. Next year's meeting will be held at Lunenburg—Echo.

THE St. John Globe says:—The dredge Cape Brton left St. John 23rd April for Digby, where it remained improving the depth of water to and at the Digby pier until July 12. She left Digby 21st July and arrived at Cape Tormentine last evening and will take up the work of preparing a winter berth for the steamer Stanley, running between Summerside, P. E. I., and Cape Tormentine, Westmorland Co., N. B.

ON Monday evening August 25th at 7.45 p. m. there will be given in Vernon River Bridge hall a lecture on 'Ireland and London' by Rev. Frederick A. McMillan of Holy Trinity parish Philadelphia. Splendid magic lantern views will be shown. Mr. McMillan has recently visited these places and has generously consented to lecture in his own home land and in aid of the parish in which he was brought up—Christ Church, Cherry Valley. The people of Alberry Plains and the neighbouring parts are justly proud of this son of their native soil. This together with Mr. McMillan's personal popularity and well known ability as a speaker and lecturer, will ensure a large, interested and sympathetic audience. Admission 15 cents.

R. LA Touche Tupper, who is here representing the Manitoba Government, in an endeavor to get hands to harvest the crop, says the Manitoba wheat crop this year will be 180,000,000 bushels, and the whole of the Canadian North West crop will be about 150,000,000 bushels. Mr. Tupper, says "We want thousands of men to harvest this crop, last year about this time 2,537 went west from St. John. This year we want quite as many or more men. I stated when here a year ago that I expected the wheat crop of Manitoba would reach 65,000,000 bushels. It actually amounted to 85,000,000 bushels; I tell you now, and I am borne out in this by the Manitoba department of agriculture, that this year's crop will be 100,000,000 bushels. This is exclusive of Territories, where the increases will be greater than in Manitoba.—Halifax Echo.

ST. JOHN GLOBE. Rev. Mr. Kirby, of Fairville Methodist church, preached last evening a sermon full of excellent lessons taught by the result of bad literature and parental inattention. Proverbs 1, 10-16, provided an excellent foundation. "My son if sinners entice thee consent thou not. If they say come with us, let us lay wait for blood, let us lurk privately for the innocent without cause," etc. In the congregation were an unusually large number of young men and boys. The pastor dealt first with the steps that led to the present condition of Higgs and Goodspeed. There were two kinds of enticement—those that within ends that without end. Evil desires and tendencies when followed always led us to sin for "out of the heart proceed evil thoughts." Illustrations from mythology and from the Greek legend of a boy who when sent with a message succumbed to the enticement of a beautiful maiden who afterwards turned out to be a hag, were used to good effect.
